LEGISLATIVE BILL 1014A

Approved by the Governor April 16, 2008

Introduced by Ashford, 20.

FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to appropriate funds to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 1014, One Hundredth Legislature, Second Session, 2008; to reduce an appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated (1) \$34,724 from the General Fund for FY2008-09 and (2) \$31,724 from the General Fund for FY2009-10 to the Supreme Court, for Program 52, to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 1014, One Hundredth Legislature, Second Session, 2008.

Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from funds appropriated in this section shall not exceed \$18,453 for FY2008-09 or \$18,453 for FY2009-10.

Sec. 2. There is hereby appropriated \$7,500 from the Supreme Court Automation Cash Fund for FY2008-09 to the Supreme Court, for Program 570, to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 1014, One Hundredth Legislature, Second Session, 2008.

No expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems for state employees shall be made from funds appropriated in this section.

Sec. 3. There is hereby appropriated (1) \$6,000 from the Commission on Public Advocacy Operations Cash Fund for FY2008-09 and (2) \$1,000 from the Commission on Public Advocacy Operations Cash Fund for FY2009-10 to the Commission on Public Advocacy, for Program 425, to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 1014, One Hundredth Legislature, Second Session, 2008.

No expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems for state employees shall be made from funds appropriated in this section.

Sec. 4. The General Fund appropriation for FY2008-09 to the Department of Health and Human Services, for Program 33, is hereby reduced by \$48,893.

Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems are hereby reduced by \$34,518 for FY2008-09.

Sec. 5. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when passed and approved according to law.
