17 At the discretion of the budget administrator of the budget division of the Department of Administrative Services and 18 19 the Accounting Administrator of the Department of Administrative 20 Services, expenditures of funds from any gift, bequest, or devise 21 may be expended through any existing or administratively created 22 Cash Fund account, Revolving Fund account, or Trust Fund account, 23 in which case the actual amount of the gift, bequest, or devise 24 is hereby appropriated to the expending agency, for the purpose 25 or purposes designated by the donor, in addition to the amounts 26 appropriated in this act. 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Administrator may create such fund account as is necessary to properly and separately account for the gift, bequest, or devise, in which case the actual amount of the gift, bequest, or devise is hereby appropriated to the expending agency, for the purpose or purposes designated by the donor, in addition to the amounts appropriated in this act.

Sec. 283. LIMITATION ON SALARIES, WAGES, AND PER DIEMS. 9 10 (1) For purposes of this act, (a) SALARY LIMIT shall mean 11 total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per 12 diems and (b) total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems shall mean all remuneration paid to 13 14 employees treated as taxable compensation by the Internal Revenue 15 Service or subject to social security coverage, specifically 16 including payments accounted for as vacation, holidays, sick leave, 17 military leave, funeral leave, maternity leave, administrative leave, compensatory time, deferred compensation, or any other 18 19 similar form, and amounts withheld pursuant to law, but excluding 20 state contributions for social security, retirement, and employee 21 insurance plans.

(2) Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems shall be limited to the amount shown except when federal funds in excess of the amount shown are available and approved by the Governor. Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from such grants shall be in addition to the limitation on permanent and temporary salaries and per diems

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otherwise shown in this act. No agency shall request any state funds for continuation or replacement of any such personnel or activities in future budget requests. To the extent feasible, requests for increases in the limitation on permanent and temporary salaries and per diems shall be addressed to the Appropriations Committee when the Legislature is in session.

7 (3) Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries 8 resulting from awards made to employees under sections 81-1346 to 9 81-1354 shall be in addition to the limitations on permanent and 10 temporary salaries and per diems otherwise shown in this act.

11 (4) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and 12 temporary salaries and per diems for FY2010-11 as enumerated in 13 this act shall be the basis for continuation funding for each 14 fiscal year of the succeeding biennium.

15 (5) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and 16 temporary salaries and per diems for FY2009-10 shall be increased 17 by certified encumbrance amounts from FY2008-09 for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems. The limitation on expenditures 18 19 for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems for FY2010-11 20 shall be increased by certified encumbrance amounts from FY2009-10 21 for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems. Encumbered 22 amounts shall be calculated in accordance with section 81-138.01.

(6) The limitation on expenditures for permanent and
temporary salaries and per diems shall only apply to remuneration
paid to state employees or per diem payments made to members of
state boards or commissions.

27 Sec. 284. The One Hundred First Legislature acknowledges

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that Article III, section 22, of the Constitution of Nebraska provides that each Legislature shall make appropriations for the expenses of the government. Consistent with this provision, any appropriations enacted by prior Legislatures for fiscal years beginning after June 30, 2009, are null and void unless specifically reaffirmed by this Legislature. Sec. 285. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2009.

8 Sec. 286. Since an emergency exists, this act takes
