Summary of purpose and/or changes: LB 282 would have provided for a refundable income tax credit for up to 25 percent of documented film production costs incurred in Nebraska. For films with budgets of less than \$30 million: a 25 percent credit if 50 percent or more of the crew are residents; 15 percent credit if 25 percent to 50 percent are residents; and 10 percent credit if less than 25 percent are residents. For films with a budget of more than \$30 million, there would have been an income tax credit of 25 percent.		
LB 282 would have further provided a cap of \$5 million annually for income tax credits approved by the Department of Revenue.		
The bill would hav	ave created a Film Office within the Department of Economic Development.
