1 FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to state intent; to
2 define terms; to make appropriations for the expenses
3 of Nebraska State Government for the biennium ending
4 June 30, 2011; to transfer funds; to provide duties; to
5 provide an operative date; and to declare an emergency.
6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.
- 2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill
- 3 passed by the One Hundred First Legislature, First or Second
- 4 Session, which appropriates funds, FY2008-09 means the period July
- 5 1, 2008, through July 1, 2009; FY2009-10 means the period July 1,
- 6 2009, through June 30, 2010; FY2010-11 means the period July 1,
- 7 2010, through June 30, 2011; FY2011-12 means the period July 1,
- 8 2011, through June 30, 2012; and FY2012-13 means the period July 1,
- 9 2012, through June 30, 2013.
- 10 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.
- 11 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2009-10 and
- 12 FY2010-11, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for each
- 13 program from the respective funds for the general operations of
- 14 state government, postsecondary education, and state aid, except
- 15 as otherwise appropriated.
- 16 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2008-09 to
- 17 FY2009-10.
- 18 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this
- 19 act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation
- 20 balances existing on June 30, 2009, for FY2009-10 to the respective
- 21 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, unless otherwise
- 22 expressly provided.
- 23 Sec. 4. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2009-10 to
- 24 FY2010-11.
- 25 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this

1 act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation

- 2 balances existing on June 30, 2010, for FY2010-11 to the respective
- 3 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, except as

- 5 Sec. 5. CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES.
- 6 All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2009, and
- 7 June 30, 2010, not otherwise reappropriated pursuant to sections
- 8 3 and 4 of this act, are hereby reappropriated for FY2009-10 and
- 9 FY2010-11, respectively, which amounts shall be in addition to the
- 10 amounts shown in this act.
- 11 Sec. 6. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.
- 12 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting
- 13 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk
- 14 of the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the
- 15 definitions for this act, except as provided in sections 140 and
- 16 281 of this act.
- 17 Sec. 7. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.
- 18 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw
- 19 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount
- 20 not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon
- 21 presentation of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay
- 22 the warrants out of the appropriate funds.

- 5 (f) From the Department of Insurance Cash Fund to the
- 6 General Fund: \$3,000,000 on or before September 30, 2010, and
- 7 \$3,000,000 on or before March 31, 2011, on such dates as directed
- 8 by the budget administrator;
- 9 (g) From the Highway Cash Fund to the Carrier Enforcement
- 10 Cash Fund: \$7,200,000. Transfers shall be made in four equal
- 11 quarterly amounts on or before July 15, October 15, January 15, and

1 Sec. 279. REAPPROPRIATION OF STATE AGENCY BYRNE GRANTS.

- 2 The unexpended General Fund, Cash Fund, and Federal Fund
- 3 appropriation balances existing on both June 30, 2009, and June
- 4 30, 2010, are hereby reappropriated for the following agencies and
- 5 programs:
- 6 (1) Agency 11 Program No. 575;
- 7 (2) Agency 64 Program No. 575; and
- 8 (3) Agency 78 Program No. 575.
- 9 Sec. 280. GIFTS, BEQUESTS, AND DEVISES.
- 10 Any gift, bequest, or devise made available to the State
- 11 of Nebraska for any purpose or purposes, together with the income
- 12 thereof, shall be allocated to the expending agency designated by
- 13 the donor or, if none is designated by the donor, by the Governor.
- 14 Acceptance of a gift, bequest, or devise shall be subject to
- 15 approval by the expending agency and the following restrictions:
- 16 (1) No matching of state funds shall be required as a
- 17 condition of acceptance;
- 18 (2) Any gift or bequest of personal property in excess of
- 19 \$10,000 shall be approved by the Governor before acceptance; and
- 20 (3) Any gift or devise of real property in excess of

- 22 Sec. 281. LIMITATION ON SALARIES, WAGES, AND PER DIEMS.
- 23 (1) For purposes of this act, (a) SALARY LIMIT shall mean
- 24 total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per
- 25 diems and (b) total expenditures for permanent and temporary

1 salaries and per diems shall mean all remuneration paid to

- 2 employees treated as taxable compensation by the Internal Revenue
- 3 Service or subject to social security coverage, specifically
- 4 including payments accounted for as vacation, holidays, sick leave,
- 5 military leave, funeral leave, maternity leave, administrative
- 6 leave, compensatory time, deferred compensation, or any other
- 7 similar form, and amounts withheld pursuant to law, but excluding
- 8 state contributions for social security, retirement, and employee
- 9 insurance plans.
- 10 (2) Total expenditures for permanent and temporary
 11 salaries and per diems shall be limited to the amount shown except
- 12 when federal funds in excess of the amount shown are available and
- 13 approved by the Governor. Expenditures for permanent and temporary
- 14 salaries and per diems from such grants shall be in addition to
- 15 the limitation on permanent and temporary salaries and per diems
- 16 otherwise shown in this act. No agency shall request any state
- 17 funds for continuation or replacement of any such personnel or
- 18 activities in future budget requests. To the extent feasible,
- 19 requests for increases in the limitation on permanent and temporary
