LB 933, as amended, changes the requirements for a school district attendance officer to report a child to a county attorney when the child has missed twenty or more days. The bill removes the mandatory requirement for a school district to report a child to the county attorney in instances where a child misses more than 20 days if the absences are documented as illnesses. The bill may decrease the number of children reported as truant to a county attorney, but is not expected to significantly impact the workload of school districts or county attorneys.
