A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Liquor Control Act; to amend sections 53-101 and 53-177, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide for a waiver of restrictions on sales of alcoholic liquor near a campus of a college or university; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 53-101, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 53-101 Sections 53-101 to 53-1,122 <u>and section 2 of this</u>
- 4 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Liquor Control
- 5 Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. (1) No alcoholic liquor shall be sold for
- 7 consumption on the premises within three hundred feet from the campus
- 8 of any college or university in the state, except that this section:
- 9 (a) Does not prohibit a nonpublic college or university
- 10 from contracting with an individual or corporation holding a license
- 11 to sell alcoholic liquor at retail for the purpose of selling
- 12 <u>alcoholic liquor at retail on the campus of such college or</u>
- 13 university at events sanctioned by such college or university but
- 14 does prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquor at retail by such licensee
- 15 on the campus of such nonpublic college or university at student
- 16 <u>activities or events; and</u>
- (b) Does not prohibit sales of alcoholic liquor by a
- 18 community college culinary education program pursuant to section
- 19 <u>53-124.15.</u>
- 20 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4) of
- 21 this section, the commission may waive the three-hundred-foot
- 22 <u>restriction in subsection (1) of this section taking into</u>
- 23 consideration one or more of the following:
- 24 (a) The impact of retail sales of alcoholic liquor for
- 25 consumption on the premises on the academic mission of the college or

- 1 <u>university;</u>
- 2 (b) The impact on students and prospective students if
- 3 <u>such sales were permitted on or near campus;</u>
- 4 (c) The impact on economic development opportunities
- 5 located within or in proximity to the campus; and
- 6 <u>(d) The waiver would likely reduce the number of</u>
- 7 applications for special designated licenses requested by the college
- 8 <u>or university or its designee.</u>
- 9 (3) To apply for a waiver under this section, the
- 10 applicant shall submit a written application to the commission. The
- 11 commission shall notify the governing body of the affected college or
- 12 university when the commission receives an application for a waiver.
- 13 The application shall include:
- 14 (a) The address of the location for which the waiver is
- 15 <u>requested;</u>
- 16 (b) The name and type of business for which the waiver is
- 17 requested; and
- 18 (c) A description of the justification for the waiver
- 19 explaining how the proposed location complies with the findings
- 20 prescribed in subsection (2) of this section.
- 21 (4) The commission shall not waive the three-hundred-foot
- 22 restriction in subsection (1) of this section without written
- 23 approval from the governing body of the college or university or its
- 24 <u>designee</u> if the physical location of the property which is the
- 25 subject of the requested waiver is surrounded by property owned by

- 1 the college or university.
- 2 Sec. 3. Section 53-177, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 3 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 4 53-177 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2)
- 5 of this section, no license shall be issued for the sale at retail of
- 6 any alcoholic liquor within one hundred fifty feet of any church,
- 7 school, hospital, or home for aged or indigent persons or for
- 8 veterans, their wives or children. This prohibition does not apply
- 9 (a) to any location within such distance of one hundred fifty feet
- 10 for which a license to sell alcoholic liquor at retail has been
- 11 granted by the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission commission for two
- 12 years continuously prior to making of application for license, and
- 13 (b) to hotels offering restaurant service, to regularly organized
- 14 clubs, or to restaurants, food shops, or other places where sale of
- 15 alcoholic liquor is not the principal business carried on, if such
- 16 place of business so exempted was established for such purposes prior
- 17 to May 24, 1935, or (c) to a college or university in the state which
- 18 <u>is subject to section 2 of this act</u>.
- 19 (2) If a proposed location for the sale at retail of any
- 20 alcoholic liquor is within one hundred fifty feet of any church, a
- 21 license may be issued if the commission gives notice to the affected
- 22 church and holds a hearing as prescribed in section 53-133.
- 23 (3) No alcoholic liquor, other than beer, shall be sold
- 24 for consumption on the premises within three hundred feet from the
- 25 campus of any college or university in the state, except that this

- 2 (a) Does not prohibit a nonpublic college or university
- 3 from contracting with an individual or corporation holding a license
- 4 to sell alcoholic liquor at retail for the purpose of selling
- 5 alcoholic liquor at retail on the campus of such college or
- 6 university at events sanctioned by such college or university but
- 7 does prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquor at retail by such licensee
- 8 on the campus of such nonpublic college or university at student
- 9 activities or events; and
- 10 (b) Does not prohibit sales of alcoholic liquor by a
- 11 community college culinary education program pursuant to section
- 12 53-124.15.
- Sec. 4. Original sections 53-101 and 53-177, Reissue
- 14 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, are repealed.
