Omaha, received a bachelor's degree in music from Northwestern University
in Chicago, and received a master's equivalent in counseling and guidance
at the University of Nebraska at Omaha; and
    WHEREAS, Bertha B. Myers taught music in the Omaha Public Schools
and always challenged students to reach their highest potential; and
    WHEREAS, Bertha B. Myers became Central High School's first
African-American guidance counselor; and
    WHEREAS, Bertha B. Myers composed and published the gospel anthem
"I Will Lift Up Mine Eyes" in 1960 with Grace Burt Taylor; and
    WHEREAS, Bertha B. Myers received many honors, including the Black
Heritage Award, the Prince Hall Grand Mason Woman of the Year, and the
Bethel Baptist Service Award; and
    WHEREAS, Bertha B. Myers was active in numerous volunteer and
professional organizations that assisted those in need and advanced the
musical arts; and
