LEGISLATIVE BILL 105

FOR AN ACT relating to the State Boat Act; to amend section 37-1241.06, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 37-1241.08, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010; to change restrictions on operation of motorboats and personal watercraft; to eliminate an obsolete provision; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

 ${\tt Section \ 1. \ Section \ 37-1241.06, \ Reissue \ Revised \ Statutes \ of \ Nebraska,} \\ {\tt is \ amended \ to \ read:}$

37-1241.06 (1)(a) No person under fourteen years of age shall operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on the waters of this state.

(b) No person under sixteen years of age shall operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on the waters of this state with an individual in tow behind the motorboat or personal watercraft.

(2) Effective May 1, 2000, and until January 1, 2004, a person under sixteen years of age shall not operate a motorboat or personal watercraft on the waters of this state unless he or she has successfully completed a boating safety course approved by the commission and has been issued a valid boating safety certificate.

(4) (3) The commission may charge a fee of no more than ten dollars for a boating safety course required by this section.

Sec. 2. Section 37-1241.08, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:

37-1241.08 Sections 37-1241.01 to 37-1241.07 shall not apply to a person operating a motorboat or personal watercraft and participating in a regatta, race, marine parade, tournament, or exhibition which has been authorized or permitted by the commission pursuant to sections 37-1262 and 37-1263 or to a person who is otherwise exempt from the provisions of the State Boat Act.

Sec. 3. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2012.

Sec. 4. Original section 37-1241.06, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 37-1241.08, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010, are repealed.
