Dear Governor Heineman, Members of the Legislature, and Chief Justice Heavican:

LB 1160 Sec.10, Nebraska Revised Statute 50-424 requires the Health and Human Services Committee of the Legislature to provide a written report to the Legislature, the Governor, and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court with respect to the progress made by the Department of Health and Human Services implementing the recommendations of the committee contained in the final report by the committee pursuant to Legislative Resolution 37. The attached document outlines the reporting requirements under LR 37 legislation. The reports and evaluation provided to the Legislature provide data, information, and reports of the status of all actions required by LR 37. These reports can be accessed on the Legislatures web site.

Additionally, information provided in the reports and evaluation will be examined through a public briefing held by the Health and Human Services Committee on January 16th at 1:30 pm. At that time more in-depth discussion and examination of the progress made by the Department of Health and Humans Services in implementing the LR 37 legislation will occur. In the briefing, the Department will provide a summary of significant steps undertaken to strengthen the child welfare system. In addition, three contractors, see attachment, will attend the briefing to provide information regarding their work. Testimony will also be provided by the Children's Commission, the Nebraska Foster Care Review Office, and the Nebraska Inspector General for Child Welfare.

A great amount of progress has been made in the child welfare system due to the dedication of the Department working in tandem with the judiciary; the legislature; child welfare stakeholders; and, especially, the Nebraska Children's Commission. The commitment from all three of Nebraska branches of government to ensure a strong and sustainable child welfare system is an important foundation for the work ahead.
