Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Sec. 53-180.06(1) of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act states that, "To establish proof of age for the purpose of purchasing or consuming alcoholic liquor, a person shall present or display only a valid driver's or operator's license, Nebraska state identification card, military identification card, alien registration card, or passport."

Therefore, under current law, out-of-state identification cards are not an acceptable form for proving one's age for purposes of purchasing or consuming alcoholic liquor in Nebraska. LB 173 would allow out-of-state identification cards for purposes of purchasing or consuming alcoholic liquor in Nebraska.
