## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Sec. 9-615.01 defines a lottery worker as, "any person who performs work directly related to the conduct of a lottery, including, but not limited to, ticket writing, winning number selection, winning number verification, prize payment to winners, record keeping, shift checkout and review of keno writer banks, and security."

Sec. 9-631.01 requires that lottery workers be licensed and spells out the licensure process. Therefore, under current law, a keno writer is a lottery worker and must be licensed. LB 259 would eliminate the licensing requirement by removing keno writers from the definition of a lottery worker.
