## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Section 2(4) describes the application process to become certified by the Liquor Control Commission to work for a licensee for 3 years. There is an application form, which requires evidence of successful completion of an approved course and examination. The application fee is \$15.00.

Section 4(1) states that retail licensees have until November 1, 2014 to have all employees who are "engaged in the sale or service of alcohol, in management, or in security for licensed premises or to be in any other way responsible for verifying a customer's age . . ." certified by the Liquor Control Commission. The licensee shall keep a copy of all of the employees' certificates on the premises.

Section 4(2) states that employing a non-certified person could result in the suspension, cancellation, or revocation of his/her license.

Section 5 requires that there be an employee or authorized representative of the licensee who is at least 21 years old on

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee amendment delays the date for compliance for retail licensees from November 1, 2014 to November 1, 2015. The amendment only requires managers, rather than all employees, to be certified and removes the requirement in Section 5 that an employee or authorized representative of the licensee who is at least 21 years old be on the premises at all times.
