Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB752 would add "an emergency responder, a state correctional employee, a Department of Health and Human Services employee, or a health care professional" to the following provisions regarding assault on an officer:

- 28-115 - Criminal offense against a pregnant woman; enhanced penalty.
- 28-929 - Assault on an officer or a health care professional in the first degree; penalty.
- 28-930(1) - Assault on an officer or a health care professional in the second degree; penalty.
- 28-931(1) - Assault on an officer or a health care professional in the third degree; penalty.
- 28-931.01 - Assault on an officer using a motor vehicle; penalty.
- 28-1351 - Unlawful membership recruitment into an organization or association; penalty.
- 28-1354 - Terms, defined. [Public Protection Act]

Section 3 amends section 28-929.01 and defines the term "out-of-hospital emergency care provider" as follows:
For purposes of sections 28-929, 28-929.02, 28-930, and 28-931, and 28-931.01, Out-of-hospital emergency care provider means
(a) an emergency medical responder;

- (b) an emergency medical technician;
- (c) an advanced emergency medical technician; or
- (d) a paramedic, as those persons are licensed and classified under the Emergency Medical Services Practice Act.

Section 10 repeals original sections 28-115, 28-929, 28-929.01, 23 28-930, 28-931, 28-931.01, 28-934, and 28-1351, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012, and section 28-1354, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2013.
