## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB982 expands existing definitions of utility-type vehicle and all-terrain vehicle, to allow new products to be titled, sold, and used in Nebraska. Manufacturers of such off-road vehicles requested the changes due to new products in development that currently cannot be sold in Nebraska because of our definitions. A new type of tire has been developed that does not contain air, it is non-pneumatic, so "low pressure tire" is changed to "non-highway tire". To make weight and width requirements more expansive to cover new product designs.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

AM1791 further expands the definitions of utility-type vehicle and all-terrain vehicle to allow for greater product innovation by manufacturers. As requested by the Department of Motor Vehicles, the amendment clarifies that these vehicles may not be retrofitted with after-market parts to be registered and licensed as on-road vehicles, such as minitrucks.
