COMMENTS: LB 463 increases from 5 to 6, the number of Juvenile Court Judges in counties having four hundred thousand inhabitants or more. The Douglas County Sheriff's Department estimates the need for two additional Deputies assigned to the District Court Security Division at the Douglas County Hall of Justice. The estimated fiscal impact from the Douglas County Sheriff's Department appears reasonable, although they do indicate needing to purchase certain equipment such as handcuffs, tasers, and personal protective equipment for these new Deputy positions in both FY 2013-14 and FY 2014-15, which may be duplicative.

COMMENTS: LB 463 increases from 5 to 6, the number of Juvenile Court Judges in counties having four hundred thousand inhabitants or more. The Douglas County Juvenile Court identifies potential costs associated with providing support staff for this additional judge. While the county would be responsible for certain operating costs relative to the Juvenile Court judges, there is no detail provided relative to these estimates, which are \$104.416 in FY 2013-14 and \$105.460 in FY 2014-15, so no determination can be made regarding the reasonableness of the estimates.

COMMENTS: LB 463 increases from 5 to 6, the number of Juvenile Court Judges in counties having four hundred thousand inhabitants or more. The Supreme Court estimate of fiscal impact from the bill includes the salary, benefit and travel costs for one additional Juvenile Court Judge and one court staff member (Court Reporter). The Judges' salary is in line with the amount set in LB 862 and the staff, benefits and travel costs appear reasonable. The revised fiscal note simply places the agency estimates in table at the top of the fiscal note form, rather than just at the bottom. The fiscal impact estimates do not change.

### Estimate is based on:

#### Salaries and benefits

Salaries and benefits for an additional two (2) Deputies assigned to the District Court Security Division at the Douglas County Hall of Justice. Currently the division has a total of 17 sworn and civilian employees; 1 Lieutenant, 1 Sergeant, 13 Deputies, 1 Law Enforcement Technician II, and 1 Elevator Operator. All employees are covered under labor agreements negotiated through collective bargaining. Additional benefits for sworn personnel include longevity pay, uniform allowance and shooting pay. Pay and benefits reflect the contractual pay scales and 2% pay increase projections made for 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 fiscal years. The total amount also reflects an equivalent of 25% for general employee benefits for sworn and civilian employees.

The District Court Division is an extremely busy division responsible for servicing sixteen (16) District Courts, five (5) Juvenile Courts, and two (2) District Court Referees. Also, the Division is responsible for answering all calls for assistance within the Hall of Justice and transporting all inmates to and from various locations (See attached transport sheet).

- Operative and Capital Expenditures
  - Operative and Capital Expenditures are for various types of equipment:
  - Officer Safety Equipment handcuffs, leg restraints, TASER Guns, personal protective equipment, etc.
  - Communication Equipment Portable radios for both employees.
