## A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT	relating to the Dentistry Practice Act; to amend section
2		38-1130, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
3		functions authorized and authorization requirements for
4		licensed dental hygienists; and to repeal the original
5		section.

6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-1130, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 38-1130 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, 4 a licensed dental hygienist shall perform the dental hygiene 5 functions listed in section 38-1131 only when authorized to do so by 6 a licensed dentist who shall be responsible for the total oral health 7 care of the patient.

8 (2) The department may authorize a licensed dental hygienist to perform the following functions in the conduct of public 9 health-related services in a public health setting or in a health 10 care or related facility: Preliminary charting and screening 11 12 examinations; oral health education, including workshops and 13 inservice training sessions on dental health; and all of the duties that any dental assistant is authorized to perform. 14

15 (3)(a) The department may authorize a licensed dental 16 hygienist with three thousand hours of clinical experience in at least four of the preceding five calendar years to perform the 17 18 following functions in the conduct of public health-related services 19 to children in a public health setting or in a health care or related 20 facility: Oral prophylaxis to healthy children who do not require 21 antibiotic premedication; pulp vitality testing; and preventive measures, including the application of fluorides, sealants, and other 22 23 recognized topical agents for the prevention of oral disease.

24 (b) Authorization shall be granted by the department 25 under this subsection upon (i) filing an application with the

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department, and (ii) providing evidence of current licensure and professional liability insurance coverage., and (iii) providing evidence of clinical experience as required under subdivision (a) of this subsection. Authorization may be limited by the department as necessary to protect the public health and safety upon good cause shown and may be renewed in connection with renewal of the dental hygienist's license.

8 (c) A licensed dental hygienist performing dental hygiene 9 functions as authorized under this subsection shall (i) report 10 authorized functions performed by him or her to the department <u>on a</u> 11 <u>form developed and provided by the department and (ii) advise the</u> 12 patient or recipient of services or his or her authorized 13 representative that such services are preventive in nature and do not 14 constitute a comprehensive dental diagnosis and care.

15 (4)(a) The department may authorize a licensed dental 16 hygienist who has completed three thousand hours of clinical experience to perform the following functions in the conduct of 17 public health-related services to adults in a public health setting 18 or in a health care or related facility: Oral prophylaxis; pulp 19 20 vitality testing; and preventive measures, including the application 21 of fluorides, sealants, and other recognized topical agents for the prevention of oral disease. 22

23 (b) Authorization shall be granted by the department 24 under this subsection upon (i) filing an application with the 25 department, (ii) providing evidence of current licensure and

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professional liability insurance coverage, and (iii) providing 1 2 evidence of three thousand hours of clinical experience. 3 Authorization may be limited by the department as necessary to 4 protect the public health and safety upon good cause shown and may be 5 renewed in connection with renewal of the dental hygienist's license. б (c) A licensed dental hygienist performing dental hygiene 7 functions as authorized under this subsection shall (i) report on a 8 form developed and provided by the department authorized functions 9 performed by him or her to the department and (ii) advise the patient 10 or recipient of services or his or her authorized representative that such services are preventive in nature and do not constitute a 11 12 comprehensive dental diagnosis and care. 13 (5) The department shall compile the data from the reports provided under subdivisions (3)(c)(i) and (4)(c)(i) of this 14 15 section and provide an annual report to the Board of Dentistry and 16 the State Board of Health. 17 (4) (6) For purposes of this section:

18 (a) Health care or related facility means a hospital, a 19 nursing facility, an assisted-living facility, a correctional 20 facility, a tribal clinic, or a school-based preventive health 21 program; and

(b) Public health setting means a federal, state, or
local public health department or clinic, community health center,
rural health clinic, or other similar program or agency that serves
primarily public health care program recipients.

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1	(7) Within five years after the effective date of this
2	act, the Health and Human Services Committee of the Legislature shall
3	evaluate the services provided by dental hygienists pursuant to this
4	section to ascertain the effectiveness of such services in the
5	delivery of oral health care and shall provide a report on such
6	evaluation to the Legislature.
