7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 81-885.11, Reissue Revised Statutes of 2 Nebraska, is amended to read: 3 81-885.11 (1) Any person desiring to act as a real estate broker or real estate salesperson shall file an application for a 4 5 license with the commission. The application shall be in such form 6 and detail as the commission prescribes, setting forth the following: 7 (1) (a) The name and address of the applicant and, when 8 applicable, the name under which he or she intends to conduct business; if the applicant will be conducting business through a 9 partnership, the name and residence address of each member thereof, 10 11 the name of the partnership's designated broker, and the name under which the partnership business is to be conducted; if the applicant 12 13 will be conducting business through a limited liability company, the 14 name and address of each of its members, the name of the company's 15 designated broker, and the name under which the business will be 16 conducted; if the applicant will be conducting business through a corporation, the name and address of each of its principal officers, 17 the name of the corporation's designated broker, and the name under 18 which the business will be conducted; and if the applicant is an 19 20 individual, the applicant's social security number; 21 (2) (b) The place or places, including the city or

21 (2) (<u>b)</u> The place of places, including the city of 22 village with the street and street number, if any, where the business 23 is to be conducted; and

24 (3) (c) Such other information as the commission
25 requires.

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1 (2) An application for a broker's or salesperson's 2 license shall expire one year after date of receipt in the commission 3 office. Sec. 2. Section 81-885.13, Reissue Revised Statutes of 4 5 Nebraska, is amended to read: 6 81-885.13 (1) No broker's or salesperson's license shall 7 be issued to any person who has not attained the age of nineteen 8 years. No broker's or salesperson's license shall be issued to any person who is not a high school graduate or the holder of a 9 certificate of high school equivalency. 10 11 (2) Each applicant for a salesperson's license shall 12 furnish evidence that he or she has completed two courses in real 13 estate subjects, approved by the commission, composed of not less 14 than sixty class hours of study or, in lieu thereof, courses 15 delivered in a distance education format approved by the commission. (3) Each applicant for a broker's license shall either 16 (a) have first served actively for two years as a licensed 17 salesperson or broker and shall furnish evidence of completion of 18 sixty class hours in addition to the hours required by subsection (2) 19 20 of this section in a course of study approved by the commission or, in lieu thereof, courses delivered in a distance education format 21 approved by the commission, or (b) furnish a certificate that he or 22 23 she has passed a course of at least eighteen credit hours in subjects related to real estate at an accredited university or college, or 24 completed six courses in real estate subjects composed of not less 25

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1 than one hundred eighty class hours in a course of study approved by 2 the commission or, in lieu thereof, courses delivered in a distance 3 education format approved by the commission.

4 (4) Each applicant for a broker's license must pass a 5 written examination covering generally the matters confronting real 6 estate brokers, and each applicant for a salesperson's license must 7 pass a written examination covering generally the matters confronting 8 real estate salespersons. Such examination may be taken before the 9 commission or any person designated by the commission. Failure to pass the examination shall be grounds for denial of a license without 10 further hearing. Within thirty days after passing the examination the 11 12 applicant must complete all requirements necessary for the issuance 13 of a license. The commission may prepare and distribute to licensees 14 under the Nebraska Real Estate License Act informational material 15 deemed of assistance in the conduct of their business.

16 (5) An applicant for an original broker's or salesperson's license shall be subject to fingerprinting and a check 17 18 of his or her criminal history record information maintained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Nebraska State Patrol. 19 20 Each After filing application for a license, each applicant shall 21 furnish to the Nebraska State Patrol a full set of fingerprints to 22 enable a criminal background investigation to be conducted. The applicant shall request that the Nebraska State Patrol submit the 23 fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national 24 criminal history record check. The applicant shall pay the actual 25

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cost, if any, of the fingerprinting and check of his or her criminal history record information. The applicant shall authorize release of the national criminal history record check to the commission. The criminal history record information check shall be completed within ninety days preceding the date the original application for a license is received in the commission's office, and if not, the application shall be returned to the applicant.

8 (6) Courses of study, referred to in subsections (2) and 9 (3) of this section, shall include courses offered by private 10 proprietary real estate schools when such courses are prescribed by 11 the commission and are taught by instructors approved by the 12 commission. The commission shall monitor schools offering approved 13 real estate courses and for good cause shall have authority to 14 suspend or withdraw approval of such courses or instructors.

15 Sec. 3. Section 81-885.17, Revised Statutes Cumulative16 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

17 81-885.17 (1)(a) A nonresident of this state who is 18 actively engaged in the real estate business, who maintains a place 19 of business in his or her resident regulatory jurisdiction, and who 20 has been duly licensed in that regulatory jurisdiction to conduct 21 such business in that regulatory jurisdiction may, in the discretion 22 of the commission, be issued a nonresident broker's license.

(b) A nonresident salesperson employed by a broker holding a nonresident broker's license may, in the discretion of the commission, be issued a nonresident salesperson's license under such

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1 nonresident broker.

2 (c) A nonresident who becomes a resident of the State of Nebraska and who holds a broker's or salesperson's license in his or 3 4 her prior resident regulatory jurisdiction shall be issued a resident 5 broker's or salesperson's license upon filing an application, paying the applicable license fee, complying with the criminal history 6 7 record information check under subsection (4) of this section, filing 8 the affidavit required by subsection (7) of this section, and providing to the commission adequate proof of completion of a three-9 10 hour class approved by the commission specific to the Nebraska Real 11 Estate License Act and sections 76-2401 to 76-2430.

12 (2) Obtaining a nonresident broker's license shall 13 constitute sufficient contact with this state for the exercise of 14 personal jurisdiction over the licensee in any action arising out of 15 the licensee's activity in this state.

16 (3) Prior to the issuance of any license to any nonresident, he or she shall file with the commission a duly 17 18 certified copy of the license issued to the applicant by the resident regulatory jurisdiction, pay to the commission the nonresident 19 20 license fee as provided in section 81-885.14 for the obtaining of a 21 broker's or salesperson's license, and provide to the commission 22 adequate proof of completion of a three-hour class approved by the 23 commission specific to the Nebraska Real Estate License Act and sections 76-2401 to 76-2430. 24

25 (4) An applicant for an original nonresident broker's or

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salesperson's license shall be subject to fingerprinting and a check 1 2 of his or her criminal history record information maintained by the 3 Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Nebraska State Patrol. Each After filing application for a license, each applicant shall 4 5 furnish to the Nebraska State Patrol a full set of fingerprints to enable a criminal background investigation to be conducted. The б 7 applicant shall request that the Nebraska State Patrol submit the 8 fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check. The applicant shall pay the actual 9 cost, if any, of the fingerprinting and check of his or her criminal 10 history record information. The applicant shall authorize release of 11 12 the national criminal history record check to the commission. The 13 criminal history record information check shall be completed within ninety days preceding the date the original application for a license 14 15 is received in the commission's office, and if not, the application 16 shall be returned to the applicant.

17 (5) Nothing in this section shall preclude the commission 18 from entering into reciprocal agreements with other regulatory 19 jurisdictions when such agreements are necessary to provide Nebraska 20 residents authority to secure licenses in other regulatory 21 jurisdictions.

22 (6) Nonresident licenses granted as provided in this 23 section shall remain in force for only as long as the requirements of 24 issuing and maintaining a license are met unless (a) suspended or 25 revoked by the commission for just cause or (b) lapsed for failure to

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1 pay the annual renewal fee.

2 (7) Prior to the issuance of any license to a nonresident applicant, an affidavit shall be filed by the applicant with the 3 commission certifying that the applicant has reviewed and is familiar 4 5 with the Nebraska Real Estate License Act and the rules and 6 regulations of the commission and agrees to be bound by the act, 7 rules, and regulations. Within ninety days after the issuance of a 8 license to a nonresident licensee prior to July 18, 2008, the 9 licensee shall provide to the commission adequate proof of completion 10 of a three-hour class approved by the commission specific to the 11 Nebraska Real Estate License Act and the law of agency relationships 12 enumerated in sections 76-2401 to 76-2430. If the licensee fails to 13 provide adequate proof of completion of the approved class to the 14 commission within the ninety day period, the director of the 15 commission or his or her designee shall place the license on inactive 16 status and notify the licensee that he or she must show cause why the 17 license should not be revoked.
