13 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 79-1312, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 79-1312 Sections 79-1312 to 79-1325 79-1322 shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Act. Sec. 2. Section 79-1313, Reissue Revised Statutes of

8 79-1313 The Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Act creates the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission for 9 the purpose of (1) promoting and establishing noncommercial 10 educational telecommunications facilities within the State of 11 12 Nebraska, (2) providing noncommercial educational telecommunications 13 programs throughout the State of Nebraska by standard digital 14 broadcast, by closed-circuit transmission, by Internet-based 15 delivery, or by other telecommunications technology distribution 16 systems, and (3) operating statewide educational and public radio and television networks, facilities, and services. The commission shall 17 18 seek funding from federal, state, foundation, and private sources for 19 capital construction and annual operations.

22 79-1314 For purposes of the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Act, unless the context otherwise requires: 23

Telecommunications includes statewide standard 24 (1) 25 digital public television and public radio transmissions and other

Section 79-1316, Revised Statutes Cumulative 8 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read: 9 79-1316 The powers and duties of the Nebraska Educational 10 Telecommunications Commission are: 11 (1) To promote and sponsor a noncommercial educational 12 television network to serve a series of interconnecting units 13 throughout the State of Nebraska; 14 (2) To promote and support locally operated or stateoperated noncommercial educational radio stations with satellite 15 16 receiving capabilities and improved transmitter coverage; 17 To apply for and to receive and hold such (3) authorizations, licenses, and assignments of channels from the 18 19 Federal Communications Commission as may be necessary to conduct such 20 educational telecommunications programs by standard radio and television broadcast or by other telecommunications technology 21 22 broadcast systems and to prepare, file, and prosecute before the 23 Federal Communications Commission all applications, reports, or other documents or requests for authorization of any kind necessary or 24 appropriate to achieve the purposes set forth in the Nebraska 25

2 (4) To receive gifts and contributions from public and 3 private sources to be expended in providing educational 4 telecommunications facilities and programs;

5 (5) To acquire real estate and other property as an 6 agency of the State of Nebraska and to hold and use the same for 7 educational telecommunications purposes;

8 (6) To contract for the construction, repair,
9 maintenance, and operation of telecommunications facilities;

10 (7) To contract with common carriers, qualified under the laws of the State of Nebraska, to provide interconnecting channels or 11 12 satellite facilities in support of radio, television, and other 13 telecommunications technology services unless it is first determined by the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission that state-14 15 owned interconnecting channels can be constructed and operated that 16 would furnish a comparable quality of service at a cost to the state 17 that would be less than if such channels were provided by qualified common carriers; 18

19 (8) To provide for programming for the visually impaired, 20 other print-handicapped persons, and the deaf and hard of hearing as 21 authorized by the Federal Communications Commission under subsidiary 22 communications authority rules, through contracts with appropriate 23 nonprofit corporations or organizations which have been created for 24 such purpose;

25 (9) To arrange for the operation of statewide educational

telecommunications networks, as directed by the Nebraska Educational 1 2 Telecommunications Commission, consistent with the provisions of the 3 federal Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and applicable rules 4 and regulations, with policies of the Federal Communications 5 Commission, in cooperation with the State Board of Education insofar as elementary and secondary education programs are concerned, and in 6 7 cooperation with the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education insofar as postsecondary education programs are concerned; 8

9 (10) After taking into consideration the needs of the 10 entire state, to establish and maintain general policies relating to 11 the nature and character of educational telecommunications broadcasts 12 or transmissions;

13 (11) To review, or cause to be reviewed by a person designated by the commission, all programs presented on the network 14 15 prior to broadcast or transmission to insure that the programs are 16 suitable for viewing and listening. Such suitability shall be determined by evaluating the content of the program, and screening 17 18 the programs if necessary, as to their educational value and whether 19 they enhance the cultural appreciation of the viewer and listener and 20 do not appeal to his or her prurient interest. When it is obvious 21 from an examination of the descriptive program materials that a 22 program is suitable for presenting on the network, no further review 23 shall be required;

24 (12) To cooperate with the United States Secretary of
25 Commerce and other federal or state agencies for the purpose of

obtaining matching federal or state funds and providing educational telecommunications facilities of all types throughout the state and to make such reports as may be required of recipients of matching funds;

5 (13) To arrange for and provide standard digital radio and television broadcast and other telecommunications technology 6 7 transmissions of noncommercial educational telecommunications programs to Nebraska citizens and institutions, but no tax funds 8 9 shall be used for program advertising which may only be financed out 10 of funds received from foundations or individual gifts;

11 (14) To coordinate with Nebraska agencies that deal with 12 telecommunications activities and are supported in whole or in part 13 by public funds; , providing program material for the Nebraska 14 educational telecommunications network;

15 (15) To adopt bylaws for the conduct of its affairs;

16 (16) To make certain that the facilities are not used for 17 any purpose which is contrary to the United States Constitution or 18 the Constitution of Nebraska or for broadcasting propaganda or 19 attempting to influence legislation;

20 (17) To publish such informational material as it deems necessary and it may, at its discretion, charge appropriate fees 21 therefor. The proceeds of all such fees shall be remitted to the 22 23 for credit to State Treasurer the State Educational Telecommunications Fund and shall be used by the commission solely 24 25 for publishing such informational material. The commission shall

1 provide to newspapers, radio stations, and other news media program
2 schedules informing the public of programs approved by the
3 commission; and

4 (18) To maintain a library of films and videotapes which 5 depict persons who appear to be digital archive of programs and 6 educational content containing stories, events, individuals, and 7 performances which are significant or prominent in Nebraska history.

8 Sec. 5. Section 79-1317, Reissue Revised Statutes of
9 Nebraska, is amended to read:

10 79-1317 The Nebraska Educational Telecommunications 11 Commission, in consultation with users of its distance learning and 12 telecommunications facilities, networks, and equipment, may establish 13 user fees, penalty fees, or other fees as necessary for and 14 consistent with the efficient and orderly use of its facilities, 15 networks, and equipment.

16 Sec. 6. Section 79-1319, Reissue Revised Statutes of 17 Nebraska, is amended to read:

79-1319 All telecommunications facilities operated or 18 19 supervised by the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission 20 shall be operated at all times on a noncommercial basis, except that 21 revenue may be generated from other nonprofit or commercial sources 22 through contractual arrangements involving excess transponder 23 capacity, excess transmission spectrum, or transmission and 24 production facilities. All contractual arrangements shall be based on 25 sound business principles that are made in the best interest of the

State of Nebraska. The commission may also enter into partnerships 1 2 with public or private entities for the purpose of jointly building 3 and operating tower and other transmission structures. All 4 telecommunications facilities operated or supervised by the 5 commission shall not produce or be involved in the production of б commercials and shall not be involved in the distribution or 7 retransmission of national commercial and subscription television 8 channels.

9 Operational and administrative service pertinent to the 10 production and utilization of <u>inclass educational</u> telecommunications 11 <u>instruction services</u> shall be made available to all schools and 12 colleges of Nebraska on the basis of the actual cost of production 13 exclusive of general overhead expense.

14 Sec. 7. Original sections 79-1312, 79-1313, 79-1314, 15 79-1317, and 79-1319, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and 16 section 79-1316, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012, are 17 repealed.

Sec. 8. The following sections are outright repealed: Sections 79-1321, 79-1323, 79-1324, and 79-1325, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
