7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 71-467, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2 2013, is amended to read: 3 71-467 (1) Each general acute hospital shall take all of the following actions in accordance with the guidelines of the 4 5 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States б Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and 7 Human Services as the guidelines existed on January 1, 2013: 8 (a) Annually offer onsite influenza vaccinations to all 9 hospital employees; when no national vaccine shortage exists; (b) Offer to all hospital employees a single dose of 10 tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis vaccine if they have not previously 11 12 received such vaccine and regardless of the time since their most 13 recent vaccination with such vaccine; and 14 (c) Require all hospital employees to be vaccinated against influenza, tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis, except that an 15 employee may elect not to be vaccinated. 16 17 (2) The hospital shall keep a record of which hospital employees receive the annual vaccination against influenza and a 18 19 single dose of tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis vaccine and which 20 hospital employees do not receive such vaccinations. 21 (3) This section shall not apply in individual cases when contraindicated or if a national shortage of the vaccine exists. 22 23 Sec. 2. Section 71-468, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012, is amended to read: 24 25 71-468 In order to prevent, detect, and control pneumonia

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and influenza outbreaks in Nebraska, each general acute hospital, 1 2 intermediate care facility, nursing facility, and skilled nursing 3 facility shall annually, beginning no later than October 1 and ending 4 on the following April 1, when no national vaccine shortage exists, 5 offer onsite vaccinations for influenza and pneumococcal disease to 6 all residents and to all inpatients prior to discharge, pursuant to 7 procedures of the facility and in accordance with the recommendations 8 of the advisory committee on immunization practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States Public Health 9 10 Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the recommendations existed on January 1, 2012. This section shall 11 12 not apply in individual cases when contraindicated or if a national shortage of the vaccine exists. Nothing in this section shall be 13 construed to require any facility listed in this section to cover the 14 15 cost of a vaccination provided pursuant to this section.

Sec. 3. Section 71-469, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2013, is amended to read:

18 71-469 In order to prevent, detect, and control diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis in Nebraska, each general acute 19 20 hospital, intermediate care facility, nursing facility, and skilled nursing facility shall offer onsite vaccinations for diphtheria, 21 tetanus, and pertussis to all residents and to all inpatients prior 22 23 to discharge, pursuant to procedures of the facility and in 24 accordance with the recommendations of the advisory committee on 25 immunization practices of the Centers for Disease Control and

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Prevention of the United States Public Health Service of the United States Department of Health and Human Services as the recommendations existed on January 1, 2013. <u>This section shall not apply in</u> individual cases when contraindicated or if a national shortage of the vaccine exists. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any facility listed in this section to bear the cost of a vaccination provided pursuant to this section.
