1 Section 1. Section 2-4902, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2 2013, is amended to read: 3 2-4902 The Climate Assessment Response Committee shall: 4 (1) Provide timely and systematic data collection, 5 analysis, and dissemination of information about drought and other 6 severe climate occurrences to the Governor and to other interested 7 persons; 8 (2) Provide the Governor and other interested persons with information and advice relevant to requests for federal disaster 9 declarations and to the use of funds and other types of assistance 10 11 available to the state because of such declarations; 12 (3) Establish criteria for startup and shutdown of 13 various assessment and response activities by state and federal 14 agencies during drought and other climate-related emergencies; 15 (4) Provide an organizational structure that assures information flow and defines the duties and responsibilities of all 16 17 agencies during times of drought and climate-related emergencies; (5) Maintain a current inventory of state and federal 18 agency responsibilities in assessing and responding to drought and 19 20 other climate-related emergencies; 21 (6) Provide a mechanism for the improvement of methods of assessing impacts of drought on agriculture and industry; 22 23 (7) Provide such other coordination and communication among federal and state agencies as is deemed appropriate by such 24 25 committee;

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1	(8) Provide the Governor and other interested persons		
2	with information and research on the impacts of cyclical climate		
3	change in Nebraska. The information and research shall include all		
4	climate forcings considered relevant by scientists, including human		
5	<u>influence, shall examine the , including</u> impacts on physical,		
б	ecological, and economic areas, and shall attempt to anticipate the		
7	unintended consequences of climate adaptation and mitigation;		
8	(9) Facilitate communication between stakeholders and the		
9	state about cyclical climate change impacts which shall include all		
10	climate forcings considered relevant by scientists, including human		
11	influences, and response strategies;		
12	(10)(a) By September 1, 2014, prepare an initial report		
13	on cyclical climate change in Nebraska which includes a synthesis and		
14	assessment of the state of knowledge on: Historical climate		
15	variability and change; climate projections; and possible impacts to		
16	key sectors of the state such as agriculture, water, wildlife,		
17	ecosystems, forests, and outdoor recreation. The report shall include		
18	key points and a summary of the findings; and		
19	(b) <u>(10)</u> By December 1, 2014, review such initial report		
20	reports submitted to the committee and provide a final report to the		
21	Governor and electronically to the Legislature which includes key		
22	points, overarching recommendations, and options that emerge from the		

23 initial report; reports; and

(11) Perform such other climate-related assessment andresponse functions as are desired by the Governor.
