5	operator at certain excavations; to harmonize provisions;
6	and to repeal the original sections.

1 Section 1. Section 76-2301, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 3 76-2301 Sections 76-2301 to 76-2330 <u>and section 3 of this</u>
- 4 act shall be known and may be cited as the One-Call Notification
- 5 System Act.

- 8 76-2320 Every operator shall furnish the vendor selected
- 9 by the board of directors with information concerning (1) the
- 10 location of its underground facilities and (2) those underground
- 11 <u>facilities the operator designates as critical for purposes of</u>
- 12 <u>section 3 of this act</u>. Every operator having underground facilities
- 13 in existence in this state on February 16, 1994, shall furnish such
- 14 information to the vendor by April 3, 1995. The vendor shall have the
- 15 center operational on October 2, 1995. The center shall be certified
- 16 by the State Fire Marshal, and the certification shall be reviewed
- 17 every two years to ensure continued compliance with federal law.
- 18 Sec. 3. <u>Unless otherwise agreed by the operator and</u>
- 19 excavator in writing, no excavation shall be performed within twenty-
- 20 <u>five feet of an underground natural gas transmission line as defined</u>
- 21 in 49 C.F.R. Part 192.3 or any underground facility designated a
- 22 <u>critical facility by an operator unless a representative of the</u>
- 23 operator of the underground natural gas transmission line or critical
- 24 <u>facility is present at the planned excavation area.</u>

76-2323 (1) Upon receipt of the information contained in 3 the notice pursuant to section 76-2321, an operator shall advise the excavator of the approximate location of underground facilities in 4 5 the area of the proposed excavation by marking or identifying the 6 location of the underground facilities with stakes, flags, paint, or 7 any other clearly identifiable marking or reference point and shall 8 indicate if the underground facilities are subject to section 3 of this act. The location of the underground facility given by the 9 operator shall be within a strip of land eighteen inches on either 10 side of the marking or identification plus one-half of the width of 11 12 the underground facility. If in the opinion of the operator the 13 precise location of a facility cannot be determined and marked as required, the operator shall provide all pertinent information and 14 15 field locating assistance to the excavator at a mutually agreed to time. The location shall be marked or identified using color 16 standards prescribed by the center. The operator shall respond no 17 18 later than two business days after receipt of the information in the 19 notice or at a time mutually agreed to by the parties. 20 (2) The marking or identification shall be done in a manner that will last for a minimum of five business days on any 21 nonpermanent surface and a minimum of ten business days on any 22 23 permanent surface. If the excavation will continue for longer than five business days, the operator shall remark or reidentify the 24 location of the underground facility upon the request of the 25

1 excavator. The request for remarking or reidentification shall be

- 2 made through the center.
- 3 (3) An operator who determines that it does not have any
- 4 underground facility located in the area of the proposed excavation
- 5 shall notify the excavator of the determination prior to the date of
- 6 commencement of the excavation.
- 7 Sec. 5. Section 76-2324, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 8 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 9 76-2324 An excavator who fails to give notice of an
- 10 excavation pursuant to section 76-2321 or who fails to comply with
- 11 <u>section 3 of this act</u> and who damages an underground facility by such
- 12 excavation shall be strictly liable to the operator of the
- 13 underground facility for the cost of all repairs to the underground
- 14 facility. An excavator who gives the notice and who damages an
- 15 underground facility shall be liable to the operator for the cost of
- 16 all repairs to the underground facility unless the damage to the
- 17 underground facility was due to the operator's failure to comply with
- 18 section 76-2323. An excavator who fails to give notice of an
- 19 excavation pursuant to section 76-2321 and who damages an underground
- 20 facility that is operated by the excavator shall not be in violation
- 21 of the One-Call Notification System Act.
- In addition to any liability provided in this section an
- 23 operator of a damaged underground facility shall be entitled to any
- 24 other remedies available at law or in equity provided by statute or
- 25 otherwise.
