The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

LB 265 allows foster children to access kinship and relative foster care more easily. It accomplishes this by:

- Defining kinship homes as homes where the caretaker has lived with the child(ren) or has had significant contact with the child(ren);
- Defining relative homes as homes where caretaker is related to the child(ren);
- And exempting kinship and relative homes from licensure. However, such homes must be approved by the Department via a background check and a home visit. In addition, such homes may volunatarily pursue licensure and would have the assistance of the Department to do so.
  - For relative homes pursuing licensure, non-safety requirements may be waived. A relative home that meets all other licensing requirements would be considered fully-licensed for the purposes of drawing federal funding from the Fostering Connections Act.
