## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Sec. 1. requires first injury reports to kept confidential and not open to public inspection. The employee may elect to waive confidentiality, and also has the right to revoke that election. The court must deny any inspection requests unless an exception applies. The exceptions include: (1) when the requester is the injured employee or employee's attorney or agent, (2) when the requester is the employer or insurer, (3) when the requester is authorized by the insurer or third-party administrator who is involved in administering the claim or an attorney representing a party to the relevant lawsuit, (4) when the report will be used for an investigation or to compile statistical information, (5) when it will be used to identify the number and nature of injuries associated with a particular employer, (6) when the report is a pleading, (7) and when it is ordered by a court.
