## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Communities in Nebraska are classified based on their populations as follows: Village-Up to, but no more than 800 inhabitants Second Class City-More than 800, but no more than 5,000 inhabitants First Class City - More than 5,000 but less than 100,000 inhabitants Primary Class-More than 100,000, but less than 300,000 inhabitants Metropolitan-300,000 inhabitants or more

This classification system allows the Legislature to pass legislation that only applies to communities of certain sizes rather than all communities in Nebraska.

LB 241 clarifies that when a cemetery lot is conveyed by certificate that the certificate does not need to be recorded with the county register of deeds. The current statutory language is stricken in the following sections: Section 15-241, page 2, beginning on line 10 (a city of the Primary Class); Section 16-243, page 2, beginning on line 23 (a city of the first class); Section 17-941, page 3, beginning on line 7 (a city of the second class and villages); Section 17-945, page 3, beginning on line 27 (cemetery associations).
