## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would enact a section to provide that a health insurer shall provide upon request to a policyholder, certificate holder, or health care provider a description of the telehealth and telemonitoring services covered under the relevant policy, certificate, contract, or plan.

"Telehealth" would be defined as the use of medical information electronically exchanged from one site to another to aid a health care provider in the diagnosis or treatment of a patient. "Telemonitoring" would be defined as the remote monitoring of a patient's vital signs, biometric data, or subjective data by a monitoring device which transmits such data electronically to a health care provider for analysis and storage.
