Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Amends section 60-6,197.06, operating a motor vehicle during a period of revocation.

Currently subsection (1) of this section provides that if an individual is convicted of operating a motor vehicle while their operating privilege has been revoked for the following reasons they shall be guilty of a Class IV felony:

- 1) Motor vehicle homicide:
- 2) Failure to stop at the scene of an accident; and
- 3) Multiple convictions for DWI or implied consent violations.

In addition to the potential criminal penalty, the court is to revoke the individual's operating privilege for a period of 15 years.

Subsection (2) is the portion of the section that is amended.

Subsection (2) currently provides that any individual having a prior conviction pursuant to subsection (1) or having a prior conviction for operating a motor vehicle during a period of revocation for operating a motor vehicle while subject to a revocation following conviction of two or more DWI or implied consent violations within a 12 year period shall be guilty of a Class III felony and shall have their operating privilege revoked for a period of 15 years.

Subsection (2) is amended to provide that when an individual has had a conviction under this section or sections
