## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 700 would expand the requirements for municipalities to provide public notices to neighborhood associations that register with the municipality to receive planning notices.

The bill would create two additional requirements:

- Cities of the metropolitan class would be required to provide notice of the adoption or amendment of a zoning ordinance to registered neighborhood associations whose area of concern is located in whole or in part within the area included in the ordinance
- Cities would be required to provide notice of the establishment or expansion of a business improvement district to registered neighborhood associations whose area of concern is located in whole or in part within a one-mile radius of the existing or proposed boundaries of the district

## **Explanation of amendments:**

AM 1889 provides that a city of the metropolitan class would not be required to provide notice of the amendment of a zoning ordinance that serves only to correct a misspelling or other typographical error.
