 section 72-2007, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
 provisions relating to the Niobrara Council; and to repeal the
 original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 72-2007, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 72-2007 (1) The Niobrara Council is created. The council membership4 shall include:

5 (a) A <u>commissioner from</u> representative of each of the county boards 6 of Brown, Cherry, Keya Paha, and Rock counties chosen by the county board 7 of the respective county;

8 (b) A representative of the Middle Niobrara Natural Resources 9 District and the Lower Niobrara Natural Resources District chosen by the 10 board of the respective district;

11 (c) The secretary of the Game and Parks Commission or his or her 12 designee;

(d) The regional director for the National Park Service or his or 13 her designee and the regional director for the United States Fish and 14 Wildlife Service or his or designee A representative of the United States 15 Fish and Wildlife Service and a representative of the National Park 16 17 Service chosen by the Governor from lists of at least three individuals, 18 or fewer if there are not at least three qualified individuals, submitted by the federal services. The members appointments under this subdivision 19 shall be nonvoting members unless and until the agencies represented by 20 these members appointees formally authorize such members appointees to 21 22 vote on all matters before the council by notifying the council and the Governor in writing; 23

(e) An individual from each of Brown, Cherry, Keya Paha, and Rock counties who resides in the Niobrara River drainage area and owns land in the Niobrara scenic river corridor chosen by the Governor from a list of at least three individuals, or fewer if there are not at least three qualified individuals, from each county submitted by the county board <u>members representatives</u> on the council;

30 (f) A representative from a recreational business operating within31 the Niobrara scenic river corridor chosen by the Governor from a list of

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1 at least three individuals, or fewer if there are not at least three 2 qualified individuals, submitted by the county board <u>members</u> 3 representatives on the council;

4 (g) A timber industry representative operating within the Niobrara 5 scenic river corridor chosen by the Governor from a list of at least 6 three individuals, or fewer if there are not at least three qualified 7 individuals, submitted by the county board <u>members</u> representatives on the 8 council; and

9 (h) A representative of a recognized, nonprofit environmental, 10 conservation, or wildlife organization chosen by the Governor from a list of at least three individuals, or fewer if there are not at least three 11 12 qualified individuals, submitted by the county board members 13 representatives on the council.

The council members shall be selected within ninety days after July 15 13, 2000. The council members shall hold office for three-year terms and 16 until a successor is appointed and qualified. The council members shall 17 serve at the pleasure of the appointing board or the Governor.

18 (2) The council shall elect a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, a 19 secretary, and a treasurer who shall jointly serve as the executive 20 committee for the council. The council shall meet on a regular basis₇ 21 preferably once a month, with a minimum of six meetings per year. Special 22 meetings may be called by any member of the executive committee or at the 23 request of a simple majority of the members of the council.

24 (3) A quorum shall be present at a meeting before any action may be 25 taken by the council. A quorum shall be a majority of the members who are selected and serving and who vote on issues before the council. All 26 actions of the council require a majority vote of the quorum present at 27 28 any meeting, except that any vote to reject or adopt any zoning regulation or variance under section 72-2010 requires a vote of two-29 thirds of all the council members who are selected and serving and who 30 vote on issues before the council. A council member may not participate 31

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1 or vote on any matter on which he or she participated or voted as a 2 member of a county board, county planning commission, or natural 3 resources district board, and in such a case such council member shall 4 not be counted for purposes of determining whether quorum or vote 5 requirements have been satisfied.

6 (4) Members shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses 7 incurred in carrying out their duties on the council as provided in 8 sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.
