Committee: Education

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to state findings; and to require
- 2 schools to develop return-to-learn protocols for pediatric cancer
- 3 survivors returning to school as prescribed.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. The Legislature finds that:
- 2 <u>(1) Pediatric cancer is the number one cause of death due to disease</u>
- 3 <u>in the United States for children from birth to fourteen years of age;</u>
- 4 (2) Nebraska ranks fifth in the United States in incidence of
- 5 pediatric cancer;
- 6 (3) Eighty percent of children with the most common types of
- 7 pediatric cancer will survive but the majority of pediatric cancer
- 8 survivors will have chronic medical conditions for the rest of their
- 9 lives; and
- 10 (4) Pediatric cancer survivors returning to school after successful
- 11 <u>treatment have specific cognitive</u>, <u>behavioral</u>, <u>physical</u>, <u>developmental</u>,
- 12 <u>and social impairments that must be accommodated in order for the</u>
- 13 <u>survivors to achieve their full educational potential.</u>
- 14 Sec. 2. <u>Each approved or accredited public, private,</u>
- 15 denominational, or parochial school shall establish a return-to-learn
- 16 protocol for students returning to school after being treated for
- 17 pediatric cancer. The return-to-learn protocol shall recognize that
- 18 students who have been treated for pediatric cancer and returned to
- 19 school may need informal or formal accommodations, modifications of
- 20 <u>curriculum</u>, and monitoring by medical or academic staff.
