Committee: Education

- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend sections 79-759 and 79-760.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015; to change provisions relating to statewide assessments and college admission testing as prescribed; to provide powers and duties for the State Board of Education as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2015, is 2 amended to read:

9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of lottery games 3 conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in Nebraska shall be credited 4 to the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. 5 All payments of the costs of establishing and maintaining the lottery 6 games shall be made from the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund. In 7 accordance with legislative appropriations, money for payments for 8 expenses of the division shall be transferred from the State Lottery 9 Operation Trust Fund to the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, which fund 10 is hereby created. All money necessary for the payment of lottery prizes 11 shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the 12 State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. The amount 13 used for the payment of lottery prizes shall not be less than forty 14 percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold. 15

- (2) A portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund as provided in subsection (3) of this section. The dollar amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03 or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.
- 30 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the Education 31 Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska

1 Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the

- 2 Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
- 3 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to
- 4 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section
- 5 9-1006;
- 6 (b) Beginning July 1, 2016, forty-four and one-half percent of the
- 7 money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 8 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be
- 9 transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund;
- 10 (c) Through June 30, 2016, nineteen and three-fourths percent of the
- 11 money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 12 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be
- 13 transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;
- 14 (d) Through June 30, 2016, twenty-four and three-fourths percent of
- 15 the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses
- and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall
- 17 be transferred to the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund;
- 18 (e) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money remaining after the
- 19 payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 20 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska
- 21 Environmental Trust Fund to be used as provided in the Nebraska
- 22 Environmental Trust Act;
- 23 (f) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes
- 24 and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive
- 25 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska State Fair
- 26 Board if the most populous city within the county in which the fair is
- 27 located provides matching funds equivalent to ten percent of the funds
- 28 available for transfer. Such matching funds may be obtained from the city
- 29 and any other private or public entity, except that no portion of such
- 30 matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair
- 31 ceases operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment

- 1 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 2 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General
- 3 Fund; and
- 4 (g) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes
- 5 and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive
- 6 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers
- 7 Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section 9-1006.
- 8 (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least seventy-
- 9 five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the Education
- 10 Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.
- (b) For fiscal year 2014-15, the Education Innovation Fund shall be 11 allocated, after administrative expenses, as follows: (i) The first one 12 13 million two hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act; 14 (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed to local systems as grants 15 16 approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs for students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 17 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the 18 19 prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) the next one million eight 20 hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early childhood 21 22 education grants awarded by the State Department of Education pursuant to section 79-1103; (iv) the next one million dollars shall be transferred 23 24 to the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to 25 section 79-1104.02; (v) the next two hundred thousand dollars shall be used to provide grants to establish bridge programs pursuant to sections 26 79-1189 to 79-1195; (vi) the next ten thousand dollars shall be used to 27 28 fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; (vii) the next two million dollars shall be allocated for 29 distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 30 and 79-1337; (viii) the next one million dollars shall be transferred to 31

1 the School District Reorganization Fund; (ix) up to the next one hundred forty-five thousand dollars shall be used by the State Department of 2 Education to implement section 79-759; and (x) the next three hundred 3 4 thirty-five thousand dollars shall be allocated to local systems as 5 grants awarded by the State Department of Education to assist schools in evaluating and improving career education programs to align such programs 6 with the state's economic and workforce needs. 7 Except for funds transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, the Early 8 9 Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund, or the department for early childhood education grants pursuant to section 79-1103, no funds received 10 as allocations from the Education Innovation Fund pursuant to this 11 subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016, 12 and such funds received as transfers or allocations from the Education 13 14 Innovation Fund that have not been used for their designated purpose as of such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska Education Improvement 15 Fund on or before August 1, 2016. 16

(c) For fiscal year 2015-16, the Education Innovation Fund shall be 17 allocated, after administrative expenses, as follows: (i) The first one 18 million two hundred thousand dollars shall be transferred to the 19 Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act; 20 (ii) the next allocation shall be distributed to local systems as grants 21 for approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs for 22 students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 23 24 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the prior fiscal year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable 25 growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) the next one million nine 26 hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early childhood 27 education grants awarded by the State Department of Education pursuant to 28 section 79-1103; (iv) the next one million dollars shall be transferred 29 to the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to 30 31 section 79-1104.02; (v) the next ten thousand dollars shall be used to

1 fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military 2 Children; (vi) the next two million five hundred thousand dollars shall be allocated for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to 3 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337; (vii) the next one million dollars shall be 4 transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund; (viii) up to the 5 next one hundred forty-five thousand dollars shall be used by the State 6 Department of Education to implement section 79-759; and (ix) of the 7 amount remaining, (A) three million dollars shall be retained in the 8 9 Education Innovation Fund to transfer to the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund on June 30, 2016, and (B) the remaining amount shall be 10 allocated to local systems as grants awarded by the State Department of 11 Education to assist schools in evaluating and improving career education 12 13 programs to align such programs with the state's economic and workforce 14 needs. Except for funds transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund, 15 16 department for early childhood education grants pursuant to section 79-1103, no funds received as allocations from the Education Innovation 17 Fund pursuant to this subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made 18 after June 30, 2016, and such funds received as transfers or allocations 19 from the Education Innovation Fund that have not been used for their 20 designated purpose as of such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska 21 Education Improvement Fund on or before August 1, 2016. 22

- 23 (d) The Education Innovation Fund terminates on June 30, 2016. Any 24 money in the fund on such date shall be transferred to the Nebraska 25 Education Improvement Fund on such date.
- (5) The Nebraska Education Improvement Fund is created. The fund shall consist of money transferred pursuant to subsections (3) and (4) of this section, money transferred pursuant to section 85-1920, and any other funds appropriated by the Legislature. The fund shall be allocated, after actual and necessary administrative expenses, as provided in this section for fiscal years 2016-17 through 2020-21. A portion of each

- allocation may be retained by the agency to which the allocation is made or the agency administering the fund to which the allocation is made for
- 3 actual and necessary expenses incurred by such agency for administration,
- 4 evaluation, and technical assistance related to the purposes of the
- 5 allocation, except that no amount of the allocation to the Nebraska
- 6 Opportunity Grant Fund may be used for such purposes. On or before
- 7 December 31, 2019, the Education Committee of the Legislature shall
- 8 electronically submit recommendations to the Clerk of the Legislature
- 9 regarding how the fund should be allocated to best advance the
- 10 educational priorities of the state for the five-year period beginning
- 11 with fiscal year 2021-22. For fiscal year 2016-17, an amount equal to ten
- 12 percent of the revenue allocated to the Education Innovation Fund and to
- 13 the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund for fiscal year 2015-16 shall be
- 14 retained in the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund. For fiscal years
- 15 2017-18 through 2020-21, an amount equal to ten percent of the revenue
- 16 received by the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund in the prior fiscal
- 17 year shall be retained in the fund. For fiscal years 2016-17 through
- 18 2020-21, the remainder of the fund shall be allocated as follows:
- 19 (a) One percent of the allocated funds to the Expanded Learning
- 20 Opportunity Grant Fund to carry out the Expanded Learning Opportunity
- 21 Grant Program Act;
- 22 (b) Seventeen percent of the allocated funds to the Department of
- 23 Education Innovative Grant Fund to be used (i) for competitive innovation
- 24 grants pursuant to section 79-1054 and (ii) for school fiscal year
- 25 2017-18, to carry out the purposes of section 79-759;
- (c) Nine percent of the allocated funds to the Community College Gap
- 27 Assistance Program Fund to carry out the community college gap assistance
- 28 program;
- 29 (d) Eight percent of the allocated funds to the Excellence in
- 30 Teaching Cash Fund to carry out the Excellence in Teaching Act;
- 31 (e) Sixty-two percent of the allocated funds to the Nebraska

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1 Opportunity Grant Fund to carry out the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Act in

- 2 conjunction with appropriations from the General Fund; and
- 3 (f) Three percent of the allocated funds to fund distance education
- 4 incentives pursuant to section 79-1337.
- 5 (6) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, the State
- 6 Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, the
- 7 Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund
- 8 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
- 9 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 10 State Funds Investment Act.
- 11 (7) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket shall be
- 12 retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and regulations. If no
- 13 claim is made within such period, the prize money shall be used at the
- 14 discretion of the Tax Commissioner for any of the purposes prescribed in
- 15 this section.
- 16 Sec. 2. Section 79-759, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 17 amended to read:
- 18 79-759 No later than the 2017-18 school year Beginning with the
- 19 2011-12 school year, the State Department of Education shall administer
- 20 may implement a pilot project for the districtwide administration of a
- 21 standard college admission test, selected by the State Board of
- 22 Education, to students in the eleventh grade attending a public school in
- 23 the state in lieu of a participating school district to determine if such
- 24 test (1) would improve the college-going rate and career readiness of
- 25 Nebraska students and (2) could be utilized as the assessment for the one
- 26 grade in high school as required under section 79-760.03. The department
- 27 shall pay the expenses of administering such college admission test and
- 28 <u>may use</u> Participation by school districts in the pilot project shall be
- 29 voluntary and shall be subject to the approval of the board. On or before
- 30 September 1, 2012, and on or before September 1 each year thereafter
- 31 through 2016, the department shall report to the Governor, the Clerk of

- 1 the Legislature, and the chairperson of the Education Committee of the
- 2 Legislature on the pilot project. The report submitted to the Clerk of
- 3 the Legislature and the committee shall be submitted electronically. The
- 4 project shall continue through school year 2015-16. The project shall be
- 5 paid for with funds from the Nebraska Education Improvement Innovation
- 6 Fund as provided in section 9-812.
- 7 Sec. 3. Section 79-760.03, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 8 amended to read:
- 9 79-760.03 (1) For school year 2009-10 and each school year
- 10 thereafter, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide
- 11 system for the assessment of student learning and for reporting the
- 12 performance of school districts and learning communities pursuant to this
- 13 section. The assessment and reporting system shall measure student
- 14 knowledge of subject matter materials covered by measurable academic
- 15 content standards selected by the state board.
- 16 (2) The state board shall adopt a plan for an assessment and
- 17 reporting system and implement and maintain the assessment and reporting
- 18 system according to such plan. The plan shall be submitted annually to
- 19 the State Department of Education, the Governor, the chairperson of the
- 20 Education Committee of the Legislature, and the Clerk of the Legislature.
- 21 The plan submitted to the committee and the Clerk of the Legislature
- 22 shall be submitted electronically. The state board shall select grade
- 23 levels for assessment and reporting required pursuant to subsections (4)
- 24 through (7) of this section. The purposes of the system are to:
- 25 (a) Determine how well public schools are performing in terms of
- 26 achievement of public school students related to the state academic
- 27 content standards;
- 28 (b) Report the performance of public schools based upon the results
- 29 of state assessment instruments and national assessment instruments;
- 30 (c) Provide information for the public and policymakers on the
- 31 performance of public schools; and

- 1 (d) Provide for the comparison among Nebraska public schools and the 2 comparison of Nebraska public schools to public schools elsewhere.
- 3 (3) The Governor shall appoint a technical advisory committee to 4 review (a) the statewide assessment plan, (b) and state assessment 5 instruments, and (c) the accountability system developed under the Quality Education Accountability Act. The technical advisory committee 6 7 shall consist of three nationally recognized experts in educational assessment and measurement, one administrator from a school in Nebraska, 8 9 and one teacher from a school in Nebraska. The members shall serve terms of three years, except that two of the members shall be appointed for 10 initial terms of two years. Any vacancy shall be filled by the Governor 11 for the remainder of the term. One of the members shall be designated as 12 chairperson by the Governor. Members shall be reimbursed for their actual 13 14 and necessary expenses as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177. The committee shall advise the Governor, the state board, and the State 15 16 Department of Education on the development of statewide assessment instruments and the statewide assessment plan. The appointments to the 17 committee shall be confirmed by the Legislature. 18
- (4) Through school year 2016-17, the The state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of writing that relies on writing samples in each of three grades selected by the state board. Each year at least one of the three selected grades shall participate in the statewide writing assessment with each selected grade level participating at least once every three years.
- (5) For school year 2009-10 and for each school year thereafter, the state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of reading. The statewide assessment of reading shall include assessment instruments for each of the grade levels three through eight and for one grade in high school and standards adopted by the state board pursuant to section 79-760.01. For school year 2017-18 and each school year thereafter, the statewide assessment of reading shall include a component of writing as

- 1 determined by the state board.
- 2 (6) For no later than school year 2010-11 and for each school year thereafter, the state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of 3 4 mathematics. The statewide assessment of mathematics shall include 5 assessment instruments for each of the grade levels three through eight and for one grade in high school and standards adopted by the state board 6 7 pursuant to section 79-760.01. If no statewide assessment of mathematics is administered in school year 2009-10, school districts shall report 8 9 mathematics assessment results in the same manner as such information was 10 reported in school year 2008-09.
- (7) For no later than school year 2011-12 and each school year 11 thereafter, the state board shall prescribe a statewide assessment of 12 13 science. The statewide assessment of science shall include assessment instruments for each of the grade levels selected by the state board and 14 standards adopted by the state board pursuant to section 79-760.01. The 15 grade levels shall include at least one grade in elementary school, one 16 grade in middle school or junior high school, and one grade in high 17 18 school.
- 19 (8) The department shall conduct studies to verify the technical 20 quality of assessment instruments and demonstrate the comparability of 21 assessment instrument results required by the act. The department shall 22 annually report such findings to the Governor, the Legislature, and the 23 state board. The report submitted to the Legislature shall be submitted 24 electronically.
- (9) The state board shall recommend national assessment instruments for the purpose of national comparison. Beginning with school year 2017-18, the state board shall select a national assessment instrument that is also used as a standard college admission test which shall be administered to students in the eleventh grade in every public high school in each school district. Each school district shall report individual student data for scores and sub-scores according to procedures

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1 established by the state board and the department pursuant to section

- 2 79-760.05.
- 3 (10) The aggregate results of assessment instruments and national
- 4 assessment instruments shall be reported by the district on a building
- 5 basis to the public in that district, to the learning community
- 6 coordinating council if such district is a member of a learning
- 7 community, and to the department. Each learning community shall also
- 8 report the aggregate results of any assessment instruments and national
- 9 assessment instruments to the public in that learning community and to
- 10 the department. The department shall report the aggregate results of any
- 11 assessment instruments and national assessment instruments on a learning
- 12 community, district, and building basis as part of the statewide
- 13 assessment and reporting system.
- 14 (11)(a) The assessment and reporting plan shall:
- 15 (i) Provide for the confidentiality of the results of individual
- 16 students; and
- 17 (ii) Include all public schools and all public school students.
- 18 (b) The state board shall adopt criteria for the inclusion of
- 19 students with disabilities, students entering the school for the first
- 20 time, and students with limited English proficiency.
- 21 The department may determine appropriate accommodations for the
- 22 assessment of students with disabilities or any student receiving special
- 23 education programs and services pursuant to section 79-1139. Alternate
- 24 academic achievement standards in reading, mathematics, and science and
- 25 alternate assessment instruments aligned with the standards may be among
- 26 the accommodations for students with severe cognitive disabilities.
- 27 (12) The state board may select additional grade levels, and
- 28 additional subject areas, or assessment instruments for statewide
- 29 assessment consistent instruments to comply with federal requirements.
- 30 (13) The state board shall not require school districts to
- 31 administer assessments or assessment instruments which are not consistent

- 1 with other than as prescribed by the act.
- 2 (14) The state board <u>may</u> shall appoint committees of teachers, from
- 3 each appropriate subject area, and administrators to assist in the
- 4 development of statewide assessment instruments required by the act.
- 5 Sec. 4. Original sections 79-759 and 79-760.03, Reissue Revised
- 6 Statutes of Nebraska, and section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement,
- 7 2015, are repealed.
