The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

The purpose of Legislative Bill 1005 is to adopt an evidence-based drug formulary for prescription drugs. The formulary would apply to those Schedule II, III, IV, and V drugs prescribed and dispensed for workers' compensation claims with a date of injury on or after January 1, 2017.

A prescription drug listed and recommended in the formulary is presumed to be reasonable and may be prescribed without obtaining prior authorization from the insurer. A prescription drug that is not included in the formulary or one that is included, but not recommended, within the formulary requires prior authorization from the insurer before it is presumed to be reasonable.

If the insurer denies payment or denies prior authorization based on the formulary, a party may request a finding by an independent medical examiner.
