LEGISLATIVE BILL 1039

Introduced by Coash, 27.

A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to developmental disabilities; to amend sections 83-381, 83-1201, and 83-1205, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-1108.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to define and redefine terms; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 71-1108.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:

71-1108.01 Intellectual disability means а state of significantly subaverage general intellectual functioning which is associated impairments in adaptive functioning manifested before the age of <u>significant</u> twenty-two years. Significant subaverage general intellectual functioning shall refer to a score of seventy or below on a properly administered and valid intelligence quotient test existing concurrently with deficits in adaptive behavior which originates in the developmental period.

Sec. 2. Section 83-381, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

83-381 As used in sections 83-217, 83-218, and 83-381 to 83-390, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (1) Person with an intellectual disability means any person of <u>significant</u> subaverage general intellectual functioning which is associated with a significant <u>impairments</u> in adaptive functioning manifested before the age of twenty-two years. Significant subaverage general intellectual functioning shall refer to a score of seventy or below on a properly administered and valid
- intelligence quotient test impairment in adaptive behavior;

 (2) Department means the Department of Health and Human Services or such person or agency within the Department of Health and Human Services as the
- chief executive officer of the department may designate; and
 (3) Residential facility means an institution specified under section
 83-217 to provide residential care by the State of Nebraska for persons with an intellectual disability. Sec. 3. Section 83-1201, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended
- 83-1201 Sections 83-1201 to 83-1226 and section 5 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Developmental Disabilities Services Act.
- Sec. 4. Section 83-1205, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 83-1205 Developmental disability shall mean a severe, chronic disability,
- including an intellectual disability, other than mental illness, which:
 (1) Is attributable to a mental or physical impairment unless impairment is solely attributable to a severe emotional disturbance or persistent mental illness;
 - (2) Is manifested before the age of twenty-two years;
- (3) Is likely to continue indefinitely;
 (4) Results in substantial functional limitations in one of each of the following areas of adaptive functioning:
- (a) Conceptual skills, including language, literacy, money, time, number concepts, and self-direction;
- (b) Social skills, including interpersonal skills, social responsibility, self-esteem, gullibility, wariness, social problem solving, and the ability to follow laws and rules and to avoid being victimized; and
- (c) Practical skills, including activities of daily living, personal care, pational skills, healthcare, mobility, and the capacity for independent <u>occupational</u> <u>living; and</u>
- (5) Reflects the individual's need for a combination and sequence of special, interdisciplinary, or generic services, individualized supports, or other forms of assistance that are of lifelong or extended duration and are <u>individually planned and coordinated.</u>
- <u>An individual from birth through the age of nine years inclusive who has a</u> substantial developmental delay or specific congenital or acquired condition may be considered to have a developmental disability without meeting three or more of the major life activities described in subdivision (4) of this section if the individual, without services and support, has a high probability of meeting those criteria later in life.
 - (1) Intellectual disability; or
- (2) A severe, chronic disability other than an intellectual disability or mental illness which:
- (a) Is attributable to a mental or physical impairment other than a mental or physical impairment caused solely by mental illness;
 - (b) Is manifested before the age of twenty-two years;
 - (c) Is likely to continue indefinitely; and
 - (d) Results in:

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(i) In the case of a person under three years of age, at least one developmental delay; or

- (ii) In the case of a person three years of age or older, a substantial limitation in three or more of the following areas of major life activity, as appropriate for the person's age:
 - (A) Self-care;
 - (B) Receptive and expressive language development and use;
 - (C) Learning; (D) Mobility;

 - (E) Self-direction;
 - (F) Capacity for independent living; and
 - (G) Economic self-sufficiency.
- <u>Intellectual disability means significant subaverage general</u> Sec. 5. intellectual functioning which is associated with significant impairments in adaptive functioning manifested before the age of twenty-two years. Significant subaverage general intellectual functioning shall refer to a score of seventy or below on a properly administered and valid intelligence quotient test.
- Sec. 6. Original sections 83-381, 83-1201, and 83-1205, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-1108.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, are repealed.
