LEGISLATIVE BILL 663

Approved by the Governor May 20, 2015

Introduced by Speaker Hadley, 37; at the request of the Governor.

A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to judges' salaries; to amend section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to change judges' salaries; to provide an operative date; to repeal the original section; and to declare an emergency.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:

24-201.01 On July 1, 2012, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred forty-five thousand six hundred fourteen dollars and seventy-four cents. On July 1, 2013, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred fiftytwo thousand eight hundred ninety-five dollars and forty-eight cents. On July 1, 2014, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred sixty thousand five hundred forty dollars and twenty-five cents. <u>On July 1, 2015, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the</u> Supreme Court shall be one hundred sixty-six thousand one hundred fifty-nine dollars and sixteen cents. On July 1, 2016, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred seventy-one thousand nine

hundred seventy-four dollars and seventy-three cents. The Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall hold no other public office of profit or trust during their terms of office nor accept any public appointment or employment under the authority of the government of the United States for which they receive compensation for their services. Such salaries shall be payable in equal monthly installments.

Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2015. Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01. Revised Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01, Supplement, 2014, is repealed. Revised Statutes Cumulative

Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when passed and approved according to law.
