Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 146 would allow anyone found guilty of an infraction (the violation of any state or local law or rule that is not a misdemeanor or felony, not including traffic violations) to petition the court to set aside the conviction after paying the requisite fine or completing assigned probation. This is currently allowed for only misdemeanors and felonies.

LB146 further goes to outline that the setting aside of the infraction conviction does not preclude its use in future legal proceedings, the application for child care licensing, or relieve an individuals requirement to sign onto the Sex offender registry.
