Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 470 has three main components intended to modernize keno.

First, the bill allows for keno operators to provide an electronic ticket to players beginning January 1, 2018. The keno operator would still make paper tickets available to players upon request (page 2, lines 27-29). If the keno game offers electronic tickets, then the operator must also provide for a means to prevent individuals from outside the licensed premises from being able to access the keno game. This could be achieved through geofencing or some other means of electronically blocking access to the game from outside the licensed premises (page 4, lines 12-16).

Second, the mandatory wait time between keno games would be reduced from five minutes to four minutes (page 2, line 31).

Lastly, a player would be allowed to participate in keno with any cash equivalent, but excluding credit cards. Currently,

keno players can only purchase tickets with cash. (page 4, line 28-page 5, line 1).
