Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 494 allows information relating to physical and cyber assets of energy infrastructure, which are deemed critical, to be withheld from the public. This includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Records
- Maps
- Drawings
- Equipment
- Computer programs
- Data
- Identity of personnel responsible for control or maintenance of such physical or cyber assets
- Other related information the disclosure of which would pose a threat to public safety or the security of critical infrastructure.

Explanation of amendments:

AM 555 changes how the information that can be withheld is defined, but does not otherwise change the bill.	
The amendment mirrors the critical energy or electric infrastructure definition contained in 18 C.F.R. 388.113, but further limits this definition to information that's disclosure would pose a threat to national security, public health or safety, or any combination of those matters.
