#### Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 768 would authorize cities of the first class, cities of the second class, and villages to make grants and loans under the Local Option Municipal Economic Development Act (commonly referred to as LB 840) for early childhood infrastructure development.

## Explanation of amendments:

AM 1586 adds businesses that provide quality early childhood care and education programs to the list of eligible business activities in the definition of "qualifying business" under the Act.
