## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

This bill would expressly authorize the Nebraska State Patrol (NSP) to conduct criminal investigations relating to conduct within facilities operated by the Department of Correctional Services (NDCS). On the bill's effective date, all correctional investigators currently employed by NDCS would become employees of NSP. The bill then requires the NSP superintendent to issue a report to the Governor and the Legislature by July 1, 2019 on the question of whether the transferred investigator positions should become sworn positions within NSP. All funds used by NDCS for the outgoing investigator position salaries would be transferred to NSP. The bill has a delayed operative date of January 1, 2019.
