- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to building codes; to amend section 71-6401,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, section 71-6404, Revised
- 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016, and section 71-6406, Revised
- 4 Statutes Supplement, 2017; to create the Building Codes Advisory
- 5 Committee; to provide powers and duties; to change provisions
- 6 relating to local building and construction codes; to harmonize
- 7 provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 71-6401, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

- 2 amended to read:
- 3 71-6401 Sections 71-6401 to 71-6407 <u>and sections 4 to 6 of this act</u>
- 4 shall be known and may be cited as the Building Construction Act.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 71-6404, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 6 2016, is amended to read:
- 7 71-6404 (1) For purposes of the Building Construction Act:  $_{T}$
- 8 (a) Committee means the Building Codes Advisory Committee; and
- 9 <u>(b) Component component</u> means a portion of the state building code
- 10 adopted by reference pursuant to section 71-6403.
- 11 (2) The state building code shall be the building and construction
- 12 standard within the state and shall be applicable:
- 13 (a) To all buildings and structures owned by the state or any state
- 14 agency; and
- 15 (b) In each county, city, or village which elects to adopt the state
- 16 building code <u>as its local building or construction code pursuant to</u>
- 17 section 71-6406; and or any component or combination of components of the
- 18 state building code.
- 19 (c) In each county, city, or village which has not adopted a local
- 20 <u>building or construction code pursuant to section 71-6406.</u>
- Sec. 3. Section 71-6406, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 71-6406 (1)(a) (1) Any county, city, or village may enact,
- 24 administer, or enforce a local building or construction code if or as
- 25 long as such county, city, or village:
- 26  $\underline{\text{(i)}}$  (a) Adopts the state building code; or
- 27 <u>(ii)</u> Adopts a building or construction code that conforms
- 28 generally with the state building code.
- 29 (b) If a county, city, or village does not adopt a code as
- 30 authorized under subdivision (a) of this subsection, the state building
- 31 code shall apply in the county, city, or village.

- 1 (2) A <u>local</u> building or construction code shall be deemed to conform
- 2 generally with the state building code if it:
- 3 (a) Adopts a special or differing building standard by amending,
- 4 modifying, or deleting any portion of the state building code in order to
- 5 reduce unnecessary costs of construction, increase safety, durability, or
- 6 efficiency, establish best building or construction practices within the
- 7 county, city, or village, or address special local conditions within the
- 8 county, city, or village;
- 9 (b) Adopts any supplement, new edition, appendix, or component or
- 10 combination of components of the state building code;
- 11 (c) Adopts section 305 of the 2012 edition of the International
- 12 Building Code without the exceptions described in subdivision (1)(a) of
- 13 section 71-6403, chapter 13 of the 2012 edition of the International
- 14 Building Code, chapter 11 of the 2012 edition of the International
- 15 Residential Code, or section R313 of the 2012 edition of the
- 16 International Residential Code;
- 17 (d) Adopts a plumbing code, an electrical code, a fire prevention
- 18 code, or any other standard code as authorized under section 14-419,
- 19 15-905, 18-132, or 23-172; or
- (e) Adopts a lighting and thermal efficiency ordinance, resolution,
- 21 code, or standard as authorized under section 81-1618.
- 22 (3) A local building or construction code which includes a prior
- 23 edition of any component or combination of components of the state
- 24 building code shall not be deemed to conform generally with the state
- 25 building code.
- 26 (4) A county, city, or village shall not adopt or enforce a local
- 27 building or construction code other than as provided by this section.
- 28 (5) A county, city, or village which adopts or enforces a local
- 29 building or construction code under this section shall regularly update
- 30 its code. For purposes of this section, a code shall be deemed to be
- 31 regularly updated if the most recently enacted state building code or a

- 1 code that conforms generally with the state building code is adopted by
- 2 the county, city, or village within two years after an update to the
- 3 state building code.
- 4 (6) A county, city, or village may adopt amendments for the proper
- 5 administration and enforcement of its local building or construction code
- 6 including organization of enforcement, qualifications of staff members,
- 7 examination of plans, inspections, appeals, permits, and fees. Any
- 8 amendment adopted pursuant to this section shall be published separately
- 9 from the local building or construction code.
- 10 (7) A county, city, or village which adopts one or more standard
- 11 codes as part of its local building or construction code under this
- 12 section shall keep at least one copy of each adopted code, or portion
- 13 thereof, for use and examination by the public in the office of the clerk
- 14 of the county, city, or village prior to the adoption of the code and as
- 15 long as such code is in effect.
- 16 (8) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Building Construction Act,
- 17 a public building of any political subdivision shall be built in
- 18 accordance with the applicable local building or construction code. Fees,
- 19 if any, for services which monitor a builder's application of codes shall
- 20 be negotiable between the political subdivisions involved, but such fees
- 21 shall not exceed the actual expenses incurred by the county, city, or
- 22 village doing the monitoring.
- 23 Sec. 4. (1) The Building Codes Advisory Committee is created. The
- 24 <u>committee shall consist of:</u>
- 25 (a) Thirteen voting members appointed by the Governor with the
- 26 <u>approval of the Legislature; and</u>
- 27 <u>(b) The following nonvoting, ex officio m</u>embers:
- 28 <u>(i) The State Fire Marshal or his or her designee;</u>
- 29 (ii) The Director of the State Energy Office or his or her designee;
- 30 (iii) The Executive Director of the State Electrical Division or his
- 31 or her designee;

1 (iv) The Executive Director of the Board of Engineers and Architects

- 2 <u>or his or her designee; and</u>
- 3 (v) The Director of the Nebraska State Historical Society or his or
- 4 her designee.
- 5 (2) The voting members of the committee shall consist of:
- 6 (a) Three representatives of home builders' associations in
- 7 Nebraska, each from a different congressional district;
- 8 <u>(b) Three local code officials, each from a different congressional</u>
- 9 district;
- 10 (c) Two representatives of commercial construction associations, one
- 11 of whom must have experience related to large-scale projects and one of
- 12 <u>whom must have experience related to medium-scale to small-scale</u>
- 13 projects;
- 14 (d) A representative of the planning department of a city of the
- 15 metropolitan class;
- 16 (e) A representative of the planning department of a city of the
- 17 primary class;
- 18 (f) A representative of the planning department of a city of the
- 19 first class, city of the second class, or village;
- 20 (g) A professional engineer as defined in section 81-3422; and
- 21 (h) An architect as defined in section 81-3404.
- 22 (3) The Governor shall appoint the initial voting members of the
- 23 committee on or before September 1, 2018, and shall designate seven of
- 24 the initial members to serve two-year terms and six of the initial
- 25 members to serve four-year terms. Terms of the initial members shall
- 26 <u>begin on October 1, 2018. Their successors shall be appointed for four-</u>
- 27 <u>years terms. In the event of a vacancy, the Governor shall appoint a</u>
- 28 member to fill the vacancy, subject to the approval of the Legislature.
- 29 Any person appointed to fill a vacancy shall meet the same eligibility
- 30 <u>requirements</u> as the person whose position is vacant and shall be
- 31 appointed for the unexpired term.

1 Sec. 5. (1) The voting members of the committee shall annually

- 2 <u>elect a chairperson.</u>
- 3 (2) The committee shall meet at least once annually at the call of
- 4 the chairperson. A quorum of more than one-half of the members shall be
- 5 required at any meeting at which recommendations to the Legislature are
- 6 adopted.
- 7 (3) Members of the committee shall receive no compensation for their
- 8 services on the committee but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary
- 9 expenses incurred in performing their duties as provided in sections
- 10 81-1174 to 81-1177. The Board of Engineers and Architects shall provide
- 11 <u>staff support for the committee, and the expenses of the committee shall</u>
- 12 <u>be part of the budget of the Board of Engineers and Architects.</u>
- 13 Sec. 6. (1) Upon the publication of a new edition of any component
- 14 of the state building code, the committee shall review such new edition
- 15 and make a recommendation to the Legislature on whether such new edition
- or any portion thereof should be adopted as a component of the state
- 17 building code.
- 18 (2) Upon the written request of the Chairperson of the Urban Affairs
- 19 Committee of the Legislature, the Building Codes Advisory Committee shall
- 20 <u>review any edition of any component of the state building code, any other</u>
- 21 standard code, or any portion thereof and make a recommendation to the
- 22 Legislature on whether such edition, standard code, or portion thereof
- 23 should be adopted as a component of the state building code.
- 24 (3) As part of a review under subsection (1) or (2) of this section,
- 25 the committee may consult with experts in the fields of architecture,
- 26 <u>structural engineering, mechanical engineering, commercial construction,</u>
- 27 <u>home building, energy efficiency, sustainability, fire suppression,</u>
- 28 electrical engineering, plumbing, insurance, and heating, ventilation,
- 29 <u>and air conditioning and other relevant fields as necessary.</u>
- 30 (4) In developing recommendations under subsection (1) or (2) of
- 31 this section, the committee shall consider:

1 (a) The purpose of the state building code as outlined in section

- 2 71-6402;
- 3 <u>(b) The potential impacts of adopting a new edition of any component</u>
- 4 of the state building code or other standard code, including impacts on
- 5 <u>building safety and durability, cost of construction, energy efficiency,</u>
- 6 and use of modern construction materials and methods;
- 7 (c) The number of counties, cities, and villages that have adopted
- 8 the new edition of any component of the state building code or other
- 9 standard code as part of their local building or construction code;
- 10 (d) The time elapsed since the most recently enacted state building
- 11 <u>code or the relevant components of the most recently enacted state</u>
- 12 <u>building code were published and adopted; and</u>
- 13 <u>(e) The extent to which other states have adopted newer editions of</u>
- 14 any component of the state building code or other standard codes as part
- 15 of their statewide building codes.
- 16 (5) The committee shall not review rules and regulations adopted and
- 17 promulgated under section 81-2104 constituting the state electrical code,
- 18 rules and regulations adopted and promulgated under section 81-502
- 19 constituting the state fire code, the Nebraska Energy Code adopted under
- 20 <u>section 81-1611, or plumbing codes adopted under section 18-132, 18-1915,</u>
- 21 or 23-172, except to the extent such codes, rules, or regulations
- 22 interact with the components of the state building code, new editions of
- 23 components of the state building code, or any other standard code
- 24 <u>submitted for review under subsection (2) of this section.</u>
- 25 (6) Upon adoption of a recommendation to the Legislature under
- 26 subsection (1) or (2) of this section, the committee shall submit a
- 27 <u>report to the Governor, the Clerk of the Legislature, and the Chairperson</u>
- 28 of the Urban Affairs Committee of the Legislature that includes the
- 29 <u>recommendation and any related findings. The reports submitted to the</u>
- 30 <u>Legislature shall be submitted electronically.</u>
- 31 Sec. 7. Original section 71-6401, Reissue Revised Statutes of

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- 1 Nebraska, section 71-6404, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016,
- 2 and section 71-6406, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, are repealed.
