## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 1063**

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to traumatic brain injury; to amend section
- 2 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to provide
- funding to assist victims of traumatic brain injury; to provide for
- 4 administration; to create a fund; to increase certain driver's
- 5 license fees; to provide an operative date; and to repeal the
- 6 original section.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) The Brain Injury Cash Fund is created. The fund
- 2 shall consist of fees credited to it under subsection (6) of section
- 3 60-4,115 and any voluntary contributions. Any money in the fund available
- 4 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant
- 5 <u>to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds</u>
- 6 Investment Act.
- 7 (2)(a) The fund shall be administered through a contract with the
- 8 University of Nebraska Medical Center for administration, accounting, and
- 9 budgeting purposes and used to pay for contracts for assistance for
- 10 victims of traumatic brain injury with outside sources that specialize in
- 11 the area of traumatic brain injury. Such outside sources shall operate,
- 12 at a minimum, statewide, and also in targeted areas as defined and
- 13 determined in the contract, with victims of traumatic brain injury; work
- 14 to secure and develop community-based services for victims of traumatic
- brain injury; provide support groups and access to pertinent information,
- 16 medical resources, and service referrals for victims of traumatic brain
- 17 injury; and educate professionals who work with victims of traumatic
- 18 brain injury.
- 19 (b) Expenditures from the fund may also include, but not be limited
- 20 to:
- 21 (i) Resource facilitation. Resource facilitation shall be given
- 22 priority and made available to provide ongoing support for individuals
- 23 with brain injuries and their families for coping with brain injuries.
- 24 Resource facilitation shall provide a linkage to existing services and
- 25 increase the capacity of the state's providers of services to individuals
- 26 with brain injuries by providing brain-injury-specific information,
- 27 <u>support, and resources and enhancing the usage of support commonly</u>
- 28 <u>available in a community. Agencies providing resource facilitation shall</u>
- 29 <u>specialize in brain injury;</u>
- 30 (ii) Training for service providers in the appropriate provision of
- 31 services to individuals with brain injuries;

- 1 (iii) Follow-up contact and information on brain injuries for
- 2 <u>individuals on the brain injury registry established in the Brain Injury</u>
- 3 Registry Act;
- 4 (iv) Activities to promote public awareness of traumatic brain
- 5 <u>injury and prevention methods;</u>
- 6 (v) Supporting research in the field of traumatic brain injury;
- 7 (vi) Providing and monitoring quality improvement processes with
- 8 standards of care among brain injury services and providers; and
- 9 <u>(vii) Collecting data and evaluating how brain injury needs are</u>
- 10 being met in this state.
- 11 <u>(c) No more than ten percent of the fund shall be used for</u>
- 12 administration of the fund. These funds are reimbursement for expenses
- 13 <u>incurred to administer the fund and the state shall not reduce state</u>
- 14 funding allocated to the university since the University of Nebraska
- 15 Medical Center is providing this service.
- 16 (3) For purposes of this section, traumatic brain injury has the
- 17 <u>same meaning as defined and described by the Centers for Disease Control</u>
- 18 and Prevention and the National Institutes of Health.
- 19 Sec. 2. Section 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 20 2016, is amended to read:
- 21 60-4,115 (1) Fees for operators' licenses and state identification
- 22 cards shall be collected by department personnel or the county treasurer
- 23 and distributed according to the table in subsection (2) of this section,
- 24 except for the ignition interlock permit and associated fees as outlined
- 25 in subsection (4) of this section and the fees for the Brain Injury Cash
- 26 Fund. County officials shall remit the county portion of the fees
- 27 collected to the county treasurer for placement in the county general
- 28 fund. All other fees collected shall be remitted to the State Treasurer
- 29 for credit to the appropriate fund.
- 30 (2) The fees provided in this subsection in the following dollar
- 31 amounts apply for operators' licenses and state identification cards.

- (3) If the department issues an operator's license or a state identification card and collects the fees, the department shall remit the county portion of the fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.
- (4)(a) The fee for an ignition interlock permit shall be forty-five dollars. Five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. Forty dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Ignition Interlock Fund.
- (b) The fee for a replacement ignition interlock permit shall be eleven dollars. Two dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be remitted to the county treasurer for credit to the county general fund. Six dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. Two dollars and twenty-five cents of the fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the General Fund.
- 31 (c) The fee for adding, changing, or removing a class, endorsement,

- 1 or restriction on an ignition interlock permit shall be five dollars. The
- 2 fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department
- 3 of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.
- 4 (5) The department and its agents may collect an identity security
- 5 surcharge to cover the cost of security and technology practices used to
- 6 protect the identity of applicants for and holders of operators' licenses
- 7 and state identification cards and to reduce identity theft, fraud, and
- 8 forgery and counterfeiting of such licenses and cards to the maximum
- 9 extent possible. The surcharge shall be in addition to all other required
- 10 fees for operators' licenses and state identification cards. The amount
- 11 of the surcharge shall be determined by the department. The surcharge
- 12 shall not exceed eight dollars. The surcharge shall be remitted to the
- 13 State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.
- 14 (6)(a) In addition to the fees provided for in subsection (2) of
- this section, the following fees apply:
- 16 (i) A one-time, fifteen-dollar fee for first-time issuance of a
- 17 <u>Class O operator's license;</u>
- (ii) A ten-dollar fee for a motorcycle endorsement;
- 19 (iii) A ten-dollar fee for issuance of a provisional operator's
- 20 permit; and
- 21 (iv) A five-dollar fee for issuance of an LPD-learner's permit, an
- 22 LPE-learner's permit, or a school permit.
- 23 (b) The fees provided for in this subsection shall be remitted to
- 24 the State Treasurer for credit to the Brain Injury Cash Fund.
- 25 Sec. 3. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2019.
- 26 Sec. 4. Original section 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 27 Supplement, 2016, is repealed.
