- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Developmental Disabilities Services
- 2 Act; to amend section 83-1216, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017; to
- 3 state findings; to provide an additional funding priority relating
- 4 to military dependents with special needs; to harmonize provisions;
- 5 and to repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 83-1216, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 83-1216 (1) The department shall administer the medicaid home and
- 4 community-based services waivers upon application approval by the federal
- 5 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Beginning July 1, 2019,
- 6 persons determined to be eligible for specialized services who on or
- 7 after September 6, 1993, graduate from high school, reach the age of
- 8 twenty-one years, or are currently receiving services shall receive
- 9 services in accordance with the Developmental Disabilities Services Act.
- 10 The amount of funding for any person receiving services shall be
- 11 determined using an objective assessment process developed by the
- 12 department and approved by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
- 13 Services.
- 14 (2) The department shall provide directly or by contract service
- 15 coordination to Nebraska residents found to be eligible for specialized
- 16 services.
- 17 (3) It is the intent of the Legislature that the department take all
- 18 possible steps to maximize federal funding. All Nebraska residents
- 19 eligible for funding for specialized services through the department
- 20 shall apply for and accept any federal medicaid benefits for which they
- 21 may be eligible and benefits from other funding sources within the
- 22 department, the State Department of Education, specifically including the
- 23 Division of Rehabilitation Services, and other agencies to the maximum
- 24 extent possible.
- 25 (4) The priorities for funding the medicaid home and community-based
- 26 services waivers under this section are as follows:
- 27 (a) The first funding priority of the state shall be responding to
- 28 the needs of persons with developmental disabilities in immediate crisis
- 29 due to caregiver death, homelessness, or a threat to the life and safety
- 30 of the person;
- 31 (b) The second funding priority of the state in responding to the

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1 needs of persons with developmental disabilities shall be for persons

- 2 that have resided in an institutional setting for a period of at least
- 3 twelve consecutive months and who are requesting community-based
- 4 services;
- 5 (c) The third funding priority of the state in responding to the
- 6 needs of persons with developmental disabilities shall be for serving
- 7 wards of the department or persons placed under the supervision of the
- 8 Office of Probation Administration by the Nebraska court system who are
- 9 transitioning upon age nineteen with no other alternatives as determined
- 10 by the department to support residential services necessary to pursue
- 11 economic self-sufficiency;
- 12 (d) The fourth funding priority of the state in responding to the
- 13 needs of persons with developmental disabilities shall be for serving
- 14 persons transitioning from the education system upon attaining twenty-one
- 15 years of age to maintain skills and receive the day services necessary to
- 16 pursue economic self-sufficiency; and
- 17 <u>(e) The fifth funding priority of the state in responding to the</u>
- 18 needs of persons with developmental disabilities shall be, upon approval
- 19 by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States
- 20 Department of Health and Human Services, for serving a dependent of a
- 21 member of the armed forces of the United States who is a legal resident
- 22 of this state due to the service member's military assignment in
- 23 <u>Nebraska; and</u>
- 24 (f) (e) The sixth fifth funding priority of the state in responding
- 25 to the needs of persons with developmental disabilities shall be for
- 26 serving all other persons by date of application.
