- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to adopt the Higher Education
- 2 Free Speech Accountability Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 8 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Higher Education Free Speech Accountability Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Higher Education Free Speech
- 4 Accountability Act, campus means the campus of a postsecondary
- 5 <u>educational institution governed by the Board of Regents.</u>
- 6 Sec. 3. The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska shall
- 7 develop, adopt, and promulgate a policy governing free expression within
- 8 <u>its campuses</u>. Such policy shall contain at least the following
- 9 provisions:
- 10 (1) A statement that the primary function of each campus is the
- 11 <u>discovery, improvement, transmission, and dissemination of knowledge by</u>
- 12 <u>means of research, teaching, discussion, and debate. This statement shall</u>
- 13 provide that, to fulfill this function, the campus must strive to ensure
- 14 the fullest degree of intellectual freedom and free expression;
- 15 (2) A statement that it is not the proper role of the campus to
- 16 shield individuals from speech protected by the First Amendment to the
- 17 Constitution of the United States, including, without limitation, ideas
- 18 and opinions individuals find unwelcome, disagreeable, or even deeply
- 19 offensive;
- 20 (3) A campus shall not take action, as a campus, on the public
- 21 policy controversies of the day in such a way as to require students,
- 22 faculty, or administrators to publicly express a given view on such
- 23 <u>controversies;</u>
- 24 (4) Students and faculty have the freedom to discuss any problem
- 25 that presents itself, as permitted by the First Amendment and within the
- 26 limits of reasonable viewpoint and content-neutral restrictions on time,
- 27 place, and manner of expression that are consistent with the Higher
- 28 Education Free Speech Accountability Act and that are necessary to
- 29 <u>achieve a compelling campus interest. Any such restrictions shall be</u>
- 30 clear, published, and provide ample alternative means of expression.
- 31 Students and faculty shall be permitted to assemble and engage in

- 1 spontaneous expressive activity as long as such activity is not unlawful
- 2 and does not materially and substantially disrupt the functioning of the
- 3 campus, subject to the requirements of this subdivision;
- 4 (5) Access to campuses for purposes of free speech and expression
- 5 shall be consistent with First Amendment jurisprudence regarding
- 6 traditional public forums, designated public forums, and nonpublic forums
- 7 and subject to reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions;
- 8 (6) The public areas of a campus are traditional public forums, open
- 9 on the same terms to any speaker;
- 10 (7) A campus shall be open to any speaker whom students, student
- 11 groups, or members of the faculty have invited;
- 12 (8) Protests and demonstrations that materially and substantially
- 13 infringe upon the rights of others to engage in or listen to expressive
- 14 <u>activity shall not be permitted. Any student or university employee who</u>
- 15 engages in such protests or demonstrations shall be subject to sanction;
- 16 and
- 17 (9) A series of sanctions for persons violating the policy governing
- 18 free expression, including increased sanctions for repeat violators, and
- 19 the rights afforded to persons accused of such violations.
- 20 Sec. 4. <u>(1) The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska</u>
- 21 shall create a Committee on Free Expression to consist of nine members.
- 22 The membership shall consist of three members from the Board of Regents,
- 23 three faculty members, and three student members. The committee shall
- 24 elect one of its members as chairperson. Members shall serve for terms of
- 25 one year. Members shall serve without compensation but shall be
- 26 <u>reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the</u>
- 27 performance of their duties as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.
- 28 (2) Each year, the committee shall provide a report to the public,
- 29 the Board of Regents, the Governor, and the Legislature. The report shall
- 30 be submitted at least thirty days prior to the beginning of the
- 31 legislative session for the following year. The annual report shall

- 1 include:
- 2 (a) A description of any barriers to or incidents of disruption of
- 3 free expression occurring on any campus, including, but not limited to,
- 4 attempts to block or prohibit speakers and investigations into students
- 5 or student organizations for their speech. The description shall include
- 6 the nature of each barrier or incident, as well as what disciplinary
- 7 action, if any, was taken against members of the campus community
- 8 determined to be responsible for such specific barriers or incidents. The
- 9 description shall not reveal any student's personally identifiable
- 10 information; and
- 11 (b) Any assessments, criticisms, commendations, or recommendations
- 12 the committee sees fit to include.
- 13 (3) The annual report shall be:
- 14 (a) Accessible from the home page of each campus' web site by use of
- 15 not more than three links;
- 16 (b) Searchable by keywords and phrases; and
- 17 <u>(c) Accessible to the public without requiring registration or use</u>
- 18 of a user name, a password, or another user identification.
- 19 <u>(4) If a campus or one of its officials, schools, or colleges is</u>
- 20 <u>sued for an alleged violation of the First Amendment of the Constitution</u>
- 21 of the United States or of Article I, section 5 of the Constitution of
- 22 Nebraska, the committee shall submit a report of the incident, together
- 23 with a copy of the complaint, to the Governor and the Legislature. The
- 24 report shall be submitted on or before thirty days after the lawsuit is
- 25 filed.
- 26 (5) A report under this section submitted to the Legislature shall
- 27 be submitted electronically.
- 28 Sec. 5. <u>Each campus shall publicly post on its web site a report</u>
- 29 which will detail the course of action implemented in order to comply
- 30 with the Higher Education Free Speech Accountability Act and the policy
- 31 governing free speech adopted pursuant to section 3 of this act. Each

1 campus shall publicly post on its web site any changes or updates to the

- 2 <u>chosen course of action.</u>
- 3 Sec. 6. All campus employees and all state departments and agencies
- 4 shall cooperate with the Committee on Free Expression by providing
- 5 information requested by the committee.
- 6 Sec. 7. (1) The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska may
- 7 adopt additional policies and guidelines to further the purposes of the
- 8 policy adopted pursuant to section 3 of this act.
- 9 (2) Nothing in the Higher Education Free Speech Accountability Act
- 10 shall be construed to prevent a campus from regulating student speech or
- 11 activity that is prohibited by law. Unless otherwise prohibited by the
- 12 <u>act, a campus may only restrict student expressive activity if such</u>
- 13 expressive activity is not protected by the First Amendment, including:
- 14 (a) Violations of state or federal law;
- 15 (b) Expressive activity that a court has deemed unprotected
- 16 defamation;
- 17 (c) Unlawful harassment;
- 18 (d) True threats, which are defined as statements intended by the
- 19 speaker to communicate a serious expression of intent to commit an act of
- 20 unlawful violence to a particular individual or group of individuals;
- 21 <u>(e) An unjustifiable invasion of privacy or confidentiality not</u>
- 22 involving a matter of public concern;
- 23 <u>(f) Expressive activity that substantially disrupts the functions of</u>
- 24 a campus;
- 25 (g) Expressive activity that violates reasonable time, place, and
- 26 manner restrictions that are consistent with section 3 of this act; and
- 27 <u>(h) Speech that interferes with the treatment of patients.</u>
- 28 Sec. 8. The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska shall
- 29 develop a policy that requires each campus to identify the person,
- 30 office, or department with responsibility for ensuring compliance with
- 31 the Higher Education Free Speech Accountability Act and for answering any

1 <u>related questions or concerns. This policy shall require that such</u>

- 2 person, office, or department receive training in ensuring compliance
- 3 with the act. Such training shall be developed and provided by the
- 4 <u>University of Nebraska College of Law.</u>
