- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Volunteer Emergency Responders
  Incentive Act; to amend sections 77-3101, 77-3102, 77-3103, 77-3104,
  and 77-3105, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to add
  volunteer departments that serve counties to the act; to provide for
  applicability; to provide duties; to harmonize provisions; to repeal
  the original sections; and to declare an emergency.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 77-3101, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 77-3101 Sections 77-3101 to 77-3105 <u>and section 6 of this act</u>shall
- 4 be known and may be cited as the Volunteer Emergency Responders Incentive
- 5 Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 77-3102, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 7 2016, is amended to read:
- 8 77-3102 For purposes of the Volunteer Emergency Responders Incentive
- 9 Act:
- 10 (1) Active emergency responder means a person who has been approved
- 11 by the duly constituted authority in control of a volunteer department as
- 12 a volunteer member of the department, who is performing services, as both
- 13 a firefighter and on a rescue squad, in the protection of life, health,
- 14 or property from fire or other emergency, accident, illness, or calamity
- in connection with which the services of such volunteer department are
- 16 required, and whose services and activities during a year of service meet
- 17 the minimum requirements for qualification as an active member of his or
- 18 her volunteer department as established by section 77-3103;
- 19 (2) Active rescue squad member means a person who has been approved
- 20 by the duly constituted authority in control of a volunteer department as
- 21 a volunteer member of the department, who is performing services as part
- 22 of a rescue squad in the protection of life or health from emergency,
- 23 accident, illness, or calamity in connection with which the services of
- 24 such volunteer department are required, and whose services and activities
- 25 during a year of service meet the minimum requirements for qualification
- 26 as an active member of his or her volunteer department as established by
- 27 section 77-3103;
- 28 (3) Active volunteer firefighter means a person who has been
- 29 approved by the duly constituted authority in control of a volunteer
- 30 department as a volunteer member of the department, who is performing
- 31 services as a firefighter in the protection of life or property from fire

- 1 or other emergency, accident, or calamity in connection with which the
- 2 services of such volunteer department are required, and whose services
- 3 and activities during a year of service meet the minimum requirements for
- 4 qualification as an active member of his or her volunteer department as
- 5 established by section 77-3103;
- 6 (4) Standard criteria for qualified active service means the minimum
- 7 annual service requirements for the qualification of a volunteer member
- 8 of a volunteer department as an active emergency responder, active rescue
- 9 squad member, or active volunteer firefighter so as to allow such person
- 10 a refundable credit to be applied against his or her income tax
- 11 liability; and
- 12 (5) Volunteer department means any volunteer fire department, any
- 13 volunteer first-aid, rescue, ambulance, or emergency squad, or any
- 14 volunteer fire company, association, or organization serving any county,
- 15 city, village, or rural or suburban fire protection district by providing
- 16 fire protection or emergency response services for the purpose of
- 17 protecting human life, health, or property.
- 18 Sec. 3. Section 77-3103, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 19 2016, is amended to read:
- 20 77-3103 (1) The standard criteria for qualified active service shall
- 21 be based on a total of one hundred possible points per year. A person
- 22 must accumulate at least fifty points out of the possible one hundred
- 23 points during a year of service in order to qualify as an active
- 24 emergency responder, active rescue squad member, or active volunteer
- 25 firefighter. Points shall be awarded as provided in this section.
- 26 (2) A fixed amount of twenty-five points shall be awarded to a
- 27 person for responding to ten percent of the emergency response calls
- 28 which are (a) dispatched from his or her assigned station or company
- 29 during a year of service and (b) relevant to the appropriate duty
- 30 category of the person. An emergency response call means any dispatch
- 31 involving an emergency activity that an emergency responder, rescue squad

- 1 member, or volunteer firefighter is directed to do by the chief of the
- 2 fire department, the chief of the ambulance service, or the person
- 3 authorized to act for the chief. No points shall be awarded for
- 4 responding to less than ten percent of the emergency response calls.
- 5 (3) For participation in training courses, a maximum total of not
- 6 more than twenty-five points may be awarded on the following basis:
- 7 (a) For courses under twenty hours duration, one point shall be
- 8 awarded per two hours in the course, with a maximum of five points
- 9 awarded per course;
- 10 (b) For courses of twenty hours but less than forty-one hours
- 11 duration, five points shall be awarded, plus one point awarded for each
- 12 hour after the first twenty hours in the course, with a maximum of ten
- 13 points awarded per course; and
- 14 (c) For courses over forty hours duration, fifteen points shall be
- 15 awarded per course.
- 16 (4) For participation in drills, one point shall be awarded per
- 17 drill, with a maximum total of twenty points. Each drill shall last at
- 18 least two hours. Drill means regular monthly drills used for
- 19 instructional and educational purposes, as well as mock emergency
- 20 response exercises to evaluate the efficiency or performance by the
- 21 personnel of a volunteer department.
- 22 (5) For attendance at an official meeting of the volunteer
- 23 department or mutual aid organization, one point shall be awarded per
- 24 meeting, with a maximum total of not more than ten points.
- 25 (6) A fixed award of ten points shall be awarded for completion of a
- 26 term in one of the following elected or appointed positions: (a) An
- 27 elected or appointed position defined in the volunteer department's
- 28 constitution or bylaws; (b) an elected or appointed position of a mutual
- 29 aid organization; or (c) an elected office of the Nebraska State
- 30 Volunteer Firefighters Association, the Nebraska Emergency Medical
- 31 Services Association, or other organized associations dealing with

- 1 emergency response services in Nebraska.
- 2 (7) For participation in activities of fire prevention communicated
- 3 to the public, at open houses, or at speaking engagements on behalf of
- 4 the volunteer department, presenting fire or rescue equipment at a parade
- 5 or other public event, attendance at the Nebraska State Volunteer
- 6 Firefighters Association annual meeting, attendance at the Nebraska
- 7 Emergency Medical Services Association annual meeting, attendance at a
- 8 meeting of a governing body of a <u>county</u>, city, village, or rural or
- 9 suburban fire protection district on behalf of the volunteer department,
- 10 or other activities related to emergency services not covered in this
- 11 subsection, one point shall be awarded per activity, but no more than one
- 12 point shall be awarded per day, with a maximum total of not more than ten
- 13 points.
- 14 (8) Activities which may qualify a person to receive points in more
- 15 than one of the categories described in subsections (2) through (7) of
- 16 this section shall only be credited in one category.
- 17 Sec. 4. Section 77-3104, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 18 2016, is amended to read:
- 19 77-3104 (1) Each volunteer department serving a <u>county,</u> city,
- 20 village, or rural or suburban fire protection district shall designate
- 21 one member of the department to serve as the certification administrator.
- 22 The designation of such individual as the certification administrator
- 23 shall be confirmed and approved by the governing body of such county,
- 24 city, village, or rural or suburban fire protection district. The
- 25 certification administrator shall keep and maintain records on the
- 26 activities of all volunteer members and award points for such activities
- 27 based upon the standard criteria for qualified active service.
- 28 (2) The certification administrator shall provide each volunteer
- 29 member with notice of the total points he or she has accumulated during
- 30 each six-month period during each year. No later than thirty days
- 31 following the end of each calendar year of service, the certification

- 1 administrator shall forward to the governing body of the county, city,
- 2 village, or rural or suburban fire protection district a written report
- 3 specifying the name of each volunteer member of the volunteer department,
- 4 the number of points accumulated by each volunteer during the year of
- 5 service, and the names of those volunteers who have qualified as active
- 6 emergency responders, active rescue squad members, or active volunteer
- 7 firefighters. At the time of the filing of the report, the certification
- 8 administrator shall notify each volunteer member of the department whose
- 9 name does not appear on the list of qualified volunteers of such fact in
- 10 writing by mailing the notification by first-class United States mail,
- 11 postage prepaid, to the last-known address of such volunteer member.
- 12 (3) The governing body of the <u>county,</u> city, village, or rural or
- 13 suburban fire protection district shall approve and certify the list of
- 14 those volunteers who have qualified as active emergency responders,
- 15 active rescue squad members, or active volunteer firefighters by February
- 16 10 of the following calendar year.
- 17 Sec. 5. Section 77-3105, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 18 2016, is amended to read:
- 19 77-3105 (1) Each <u>county</u>, city, village, or rural or suburban fire
- 20 protection district shall file with the Department of Revenue a certified
- 21 list of those volunteers who have qualified as active emergency
- 22 responders, active rescue squad members, or active volunteer firefighters
- 23 for the immediately preceding calendar year of service no later than
- 24 February 15.
- 25 (2) For taxable years beginning or deemed to begin on or after
- 26 January 1, 2017, under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended,
- 27 each volunteer on the list described in subsection (1) of this section
- 28 shall receive a refundable credit against the income tax imposed by the
- 29 Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967 in an amount equal to two hundred fifty
- 30 dollars beginning with the second taxable year in which such volunteer is
- 31 included on such list.

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- 1 Sec. 6. (1) The changes made in sections 77-3102, 77-3103, 77-3104,
- 2 and 77-3105 by this legislative bill shall apply retroactively to July
- 3 21, 2016.
- 4 (2) For any volunteer member of a volunteer department serving a
- 5 county, such volunteer member's service and activities during calendar
- 6 year 2016 and calendar year 2017 shall count towards qualification as an
- 7 active emergency responder, active rescue squad member, or active
- 8 volunteer firefighter for each respective year if the following steps are
- 9 taken:
- 10 (a) The certification administrator of a volunteer department
- 11 serving a county shall, no later than twenty days after the effective
- 12 <u>date of this act, forward to the county board a written report specifying</u>
- 13 the name of each volunteer member of the volunteer department, the number
- 14 of points accumulated by each volunteer during calendar year 2016 and
- 15 <u>calendar year 2017, respectively, and the names of those volunteers who</u>
- 16 qualified as an active emergency responder, active rescue squad member,
- 17 or active volunteer firefighter for each respective year; and
- 18 (b) The county board shall, no later than thirty days after the
- 19 <u>effective date of this act, (i) approve and certify the list of those</u>
- 20 <u>volunteers who qualified as an active emergency responder, active rescue</u>
- 21 squad member, or active volunteer firefighter for calendar year 2016,
- 22 (ii) approve and certify the list of those volunteers who qualified as an
- 23 active emergency responder, active rescue squad member, or active
- 24 volunteer firefighter for calendar year 2017, and (iii) file the two
- 25 <u>certified lists with the Department of Revenue.</u>
- 26 (3) If the requirements of subsection (2) of this section are met,
- 27 each of the two certified lists filed with the Department of Revenue
- 28 under subdivision (2)(b) of this section shall be treated as if they had
- 29 been timely filed under subsection (1) of section 77-3105 and shall be
- 30 used in determining eligibility for the refundable income tax credit
- 31 provided in subsection (2) of section 77-3105. If a volunteer member of a

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- 1 <u>volunteer department serving a county qualified as an active emergency</u>
- 2 <u>responder</u>, active rescue squad member, or active volunteer firefighter
- 3 for both 2016 and 2017, as shown on the certified lists filed with the
- 4 Department of Revenue under subdivision (2)(b) of this section, such
- 5 <u>volunteer member shall receive the refundable income tax credit provided</u>
- 6 in subsection (2) of section 77-3105 for the 2017 tax year.
- 7 Sec. 7. Original sections 77-3101, 77-3102, 77-3103, 77-3104, and
- 8 77-3105, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016, are repealed.
- 9 Sec. 8. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 10 passed and approved according to law.
