## **Introducer's Statement of Intent**

## LB801

#### Date of Hearing: February 12, 2018

The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

LB801 would create a pilot project named Panhandle Beginnings, which would be established as a collaborative educational and therapeutic facility in Western Nebraska. The facility would serve as a setting for day treatment, day school, and intensive outpatient services for school-aged children through 21 years of age. Duration of stay would be anywhere from 21-90 days in a therapeutic setting.

Enrollees would generally need to meet the following requirements to be admitted into the program:

- 1. Therapeutic diagnosis and/or previous interventions in a less restrictive environment have proven inadequate
- 2. Medically stable and does not require 24-hour care
- 3. Parents or legal guardians' consent
- 4. Verified as a student with disability under the federal Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act

An advisory board would be created consisting of the following:

- 1. Two representatives from ESU 13
- 2. Two representatives from Region I Behavioral Health Authority
- 3. Two representatives from any of the school districts in the Panhandle
- 4. One private industry professional
