

AMENDMENTS TO LB690

Introduced by Judiciary.

1 1. Strike the original sections and insert the following new
2 sections:

3 Section 1. Sections 1 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be
4 cited as the Healthy Pregnancies for Incarcerated Women Act.

5 Sec. 2. The Legislature finds and declares:

6 (1) Restraining a pregnant woman can pose undue health risks to the
7 woman and her pregnancy;

8 (2) The majority of female prisoners and detainees in Nebraska are
9 nonviolent offenders;

10 (3) Restraining prisoners and detainees increases their potential
11 for physical harm from an accidental trip or fall. The impact of such
12 harm to a pregnant woman can negatively impact her pregnancy;

13 (4) Freedom from physical restraints is especially critical during
14 labor, delivery, and postpartum recovery after delivery. Women often need
15 to move around during labor and recovery, including moving their legs as
16 part of the birthing process. Restraints on a pregnant woman can
17 interfere with medical staff's ability to appropriately assist in
18 childbirth or to conduct sudden emergency procedures; and

19 (5) The Federal Bureau of Prisons, the United States Marshals
20 Service, the American Correctional Association, the American College of
21 Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the American Medical Association, and
22 the American Public Health Association all oppose or severely limit the
23 routine shackling of women during labor, delivery, and postpartum
24 recovery because it is unnecessary and dangerous to a woman's health and
25 well-being and creates an unnecessary risk to the baby during birth.

26 Sec. 3. For the purposes of the Healthy Pregnancies for
27 Incarcerated Women Act:

1 (1) Administrator means the Director of Correctional Services, the
2 sheriff or other person charged with administration of a jail, or any
3 other official responsible for the administration of a detention
4 facility;

5 (2) Detainee includes any adult or juvenile female detained under
6 the immigration laws of the United States at any detention facility;

7 (3) Detention facility means any:

8 (a) Facility operated by the Department of Correctional Services;

9 (b) City or county jail;

10 (c) Juvenile detention facility or staff secure juvenile facility as
11 such terms are defined in section 83-4,125; or

12 (d) Any other entity or institution operated by the state, a
13 political subdivision, or a combination of political subdivisions for the
14 careful keeping or rehabilitative needs of prisoners or detainees;

15 (4) Labor means the period of time before a birth during which
16 contractions are of sufficient frequency, intensity, and duration to
17 bring about effacement and progressive dilation of the cervix;

18 (5) Postpartum recovery means, as determined by her physician, the
19 period immediately following delivery, including the entire period a
20 woman is in the hospital or infirmary after birth;

21 (6) Prisoner means any adult or juvenile incarcerated or detained in
22 any detention facility and includes, but is not limited to, any adult or
23 juvenile who is accused of, convicted of, sentenced for, or adjudicated
24 for violations of criminal law or the terms and conditions of parole,
25 probation, pretrial release, post-release supervision, or a diversionary
26 program; and

27 (7) Restraints means any physical restraint or mechanical device
28 used to control the movement of a prisoner or detainee's body or limbs,
29 including, but not limited to, flex cuffs, soft restraints, hard metal
30 handcuffs, a black box, Chubb cuffs, leg irons, belly chains, a security
31 or tether chain, or a convex shield.

1 Sec. 4. (1) A detention facility shall not use restraints on a
2 prisoner or detainee known to be pregnant, including during labor,
3 delivery, or postpartum recovery or during transport to a medical
4 facility or birthing center, unless the administrator makes an
5 individualized determination that there are extraordinary circumstances
6 as described in subsection (2) of this section.

7 (2) Restraints for an extraordinary circumstance are only permitted
8 if the administrator makes an individualized determination that there is
9 a substantial flight risk or some other extraordinary medical or security
10 circumstance that dictates restraints be used to ensure the safety and
11 security of the prisoner or detainee known to be pregnant, the staff of
12 the detention facility or medical facility, other prisoners or detainees,
13 or the public, except that:

14 (a) If the doctor, nurse, or other health professional treating the
15 prisoner or detainee known to be pregnant requests that restraints not be
16 used, any detention facility employee accompanying the prisoner or
17 detainee shall immediately remove all restraints;

18 (b) Under no circumstances shall leg or waist restraints be used on
19 the prisoner or detainee known to be pregnant unless the prisoner or
20 detainee presents an immediate and serious risk of harm or a substantial
21 and immediate flight risk; and

22 (c) Under no circumstances shall any restraints be used on any
23 prisoner or detainee in labor or during childbirth unless the prisoner or
24 detainee presents an immediate and serious risk of harm or a substantial
25 and immediate flight risk.

26 (3) Upon a prisoner or detainee's admission to a medical facility or
27 birthing center for labor or childbirth, no detention facility employee
28 shall remain present in the room during labor or childbirth, unless
29 specifically requested or approved by medical personnel. A detention
30 facility employee may ask medical personnel to allow such employee to
31 remain present. If a detention facility employee's presence is requested

1 or approved by medical personnel, the employee shall, if practicable, be
2 female.

3 (4) If restraints are used on a prisoner or detainee known to be
4 pregnant pursuant to subsection (2) of this section:

5 (a) The type of restraint applied and the application of the
6 restraint must be done in the least restrictive manner necessary; and

7 (b) The administrator shall make written findings within ten days as
8 to the extraordinary circumstances that dictated the use of the
9 restraints. These findings shall be kept on file by the detention
10 facility for at least five years and be made available for public
11 inspection, except that no individually identifying information of the
12 prisoner or detainee shall be made public under this section without the
13 prisoner or detainee's prior written consent.

14 Sec. 5. Any prisoner or detainee restrained in violation of the
15 Healthy Pregnancies for Incarcerated Women Act may file a civil action
16 which shall be pursued as a tort claim under the Political Subdivisions
17 Tort Claims Act or the State Tort Claims Act.

18 Sec. 6. (1) On or before October 1, 2019, each detention facility
19 in this state shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry
20 out the Healthy Pregnancies for Incarcerated Women Act. A detention
21 facility may also adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations
22 developed by the Jail Standards Board or the Nebraska Commission on Law
23 Enforcement and Criminal Justice. Such rules and regulations shall be
24 included in any handbook for prisoners or detainees.

25 (2) On and after October 1, 2019, a detention facility shall inform
26 each prisoner or detainee of the rules and regulations adopted and
27 promulgated under this section upon admission to the detention facility.

28 (3) On or before November 1, 2019, a detention facility shall inform
29 any prisoner or detainee in custody of the detention facility, who has
30 not previously been informed, of the rules and regulations adopted and
31 promulgated under this section.

1 Sec. 7. On or before June 1, 2020, and each June 1 thereafter, each
2 administrator of a detention facility shall submit a report describing
3 any use of restraints on a pregnant prisoner or detainee in the preceding
4 calendar year. The Director of Correctional Services shall submit such
5 report to the Inspector General of the Nebraska Correctional System. An
6 administrator of a detention facility operated by a political subdivision
7 shall submit such report to the Jail Standards Board. The report shall
8 not contain individually identifying information of any prisoner or
9 detainee. Such reports shall be made available for public inspection.

10 Sec. 8. Section 13-910, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
11 2018, is amended to read:

12 13-910 The Political Subdivisions Tort Claims Act and sections
13 16-727, 16-728, 23-175, 39-809, and 79-610 shall not apply to:

14 (1) Any claim based upon an act or omission of an employee of a
15 political subdivision, exercising due care, in the execution of a
16 statute, ordinance, or officially adopted resolution, rule, or
17 regulation, whether or not such statute, ordinance, resolution, rule, or
18 regulation is valid;

19 (2) Any claim based upon the exercise or performance of or the
20 failure to exercise or perform a discretionary function or duty on the
21 part of the political subdivision or an employee of the political
22 subdivision, whether or not the discretion is abused;

23 (3) Any claim based upon the failure to make an inspection or making
24 an inadequate or negligent inspection of any property other than property
25 owned by or leased to such political subdivision to determine whether the
26 property complies with or violates any statute, ordinance, rule, or
27 regulation or contains a hazard to public health or safety unless the
28 political subdivision had reasonable notice of such hazard or the failure
29 to inspect or inadequate or negligent inspection constitutes a reckless
30 disregard for public health or safety;

31 (4) Any claim based upon the issuance, denial, suspension, or

1 revocation of or failure or refusal to issue, deny, suspend, or revoke
2 any permit, license, certificate, or order. Nothing in this subdivision
3 shall be construed to limit a political subdivision's liability for any
4 claim based upon the negligent execution by an employee of the political
5 subdivision in the issuance of a certificate of title under the Motor
6 Vehicle Certificate of Title Act and the State Boat Act except when such
7 title is issued upon an application filed electronically by an approved
8 licensed dealer participating in the electronic dealer services system
9 pursuant to section 60-1507;

10 (5) Any claim arising with respect to the assessment or collection
11 of any tax or fee or the detention of any goods or merchandise by any law
12 enforcement officer;

13 (6) Any claim caused by the imposition or establishment of a
14 quarantine by the state or a political subdivision, whether such
15 quarantine relates to persons or property;

16 (7) Any claim arising out of assault, battery, false arrest, false
17 imprisonment, malicious prosecution, abuse of process, libel, slander,
18 misrepresentation, deceit, or interference with contract rights, except
19 that this subdivision does not apply to a claim under the Health
20 Pregnancies for Incarcerated Women Act;

21 (8) Any claim by an employee of the political subdivision which is
22 covered by the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Act;

23 (9) Any claim arising out of the malfunction, destruction, or
24 unauthorized removal of any traffic or road sign, signal, or warning
25 device unless it is not corrected by the political subdivision
26 responsible within a reasonable time after actual or constructive notice
27 of such malfunction, destruction, or removal. Nothing in this subdivision
28 shall give rise to liability arising from an act or omission of any
29 political subdivision in placing or removing any traffic or road signs,
30 signals, or warning devices when such placement or removal is the result
31 of a discretionary act of the political subdivision;

1 (10) Any claim arising out of snow or ice conditions or other
2 temporary conditions caused by nature on any highway as defined in
3 section 60-624, bridge, public thoroughfare, or other public place due to
4 weather conditions. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to
5 limit a political subdivision's liability for any claim arising out of
6 the operation of a motor vehicle by an employee of the political
7 subdivision while acting within the course and scope of his or her
8 employment by the political subdivision;

9 (11) Any claim arising out of the plan or design for the
10 construction of or an improvement to any highway as defined in such
11 section or bridge, either in original construction or any improvement
12 thereto, if the plan or design is approved in advance of the construction
13 or improvement by the governing body of the political subdivision or some
14 other body or employee exercising discretionary authority to give such
15 approval;

16 (12) Any claim arising out of the alleged insufficiency or want of
17 repair of any highway as defined in such section, bridge, or other public
18 thoroughfare. Insufficiency or want of repair shall be construed to refer
19 to the general or overall condition and shall not refer to a spot or
20 localized defect. A political subdivision shall be deemed to waive its
21 immunity for a claim due to a spot or localized defect only if (a) the
22 political subdivision has had actual or constructive notice of the defect
23 within a reasonable time to allow repair prior to the incident giving
24 rise to the claim or (b) the claim arose during the time specified in a
25 notice provided by the political subdivision pursuant to subsection (3)
26 of section 39-1359 and the state or political subdivision had actual or
27 constructive notice; or

28 (13)(a) Any claim relating to recreational activities for which no
29 fee is charged (i) resulting from the inherent risk of the recreational
30 activity, (ii) arising out of a spot or localized defect of the premises
31 unless the spot or localized defect is not corrected by the political

1 subdivision leasing, owning, or in control of the premises within a
2 reasonable time after actual or constructive notice of the spot or
3 localized defect, or (iii) arising out of the design of a skatepark or
4 bicycle motocross park constructed for purposes of skateboarding, inline
5 skating, bicycling, or scootering that was constructed or reconstructed,
6 reasonably and in good faith, in accordance with generally recognized
7 engineering or safety standards or design theories in existence at the
8 time of the construction or reconstruction. For purposes of this
9 subdivision, a political subdivision shall be charged with constructive
10 notice only when the failure to discover the spot or localized defect of
11 the premises is the result of gross negligence.

12 (b) For purposes of this subdivision:

13 (i) Recreational activities include, but are not limited to, whether
14 as a participant or spectator: Hunting, fishing, swimming, boating,
15 camping, picnicking, hiking, walking, running, horseback riding, use of
16 trails, nature study, waterskiing, winter sports, use of playground
17 equipment, biking, roller blading, skateboarding, golfing, athletic
18 contests; visiting, viewing, or enjoying entertainment events, festivals,
19 or historical, archaeological, scenic, or scientific sites; and similar
20 leisure activities;

21 (ii) Inherent risk of recreational activities means those risks that
22 are characteristic of, intrinsic to, or an integral part of the activity;

23 (iii) Gross negligence means the absence of even slight care in the
24 performance of a duty involving an unreasonable risk of harm; and

25 (iv) Fee means a fee to participate in or be a spectator at a
26 recreational activity. A fee shall include payment by the claimant to any
27 person or organization other than the political subdivision only to the
28 extent the political subdivision retains control over the premises or the
29 activity. A fee shall not include payment of a fee or charge for parking
30 or vehicle entry.

31 (c) This subdivision, and not subdivision (3) of this section, shall

1 apply to any claim arising from the inspection or failure to make an
2 inspection or negligent inspection of premises owned or leased by the
3 political subdivision and used for recreational activities.

4 Sec. 9. Section 81-8,219, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
5 2018, is amended to read:

6 81-8,219 The State Tort Claims Act shall not apply to:

7 (1) Any claim based upon an act or omission of an employee of the
8 state, exercising due care, in the execution of a statute, rule, or
9 regulation, whether or not such statute, rule, or regulation is valid, or
10 based upon the exercise or performance or the failure to exercise or
11 perform a discretionary function or duty on the part of a state agency or
12 an employee of the state, whether or not the discretion is abused;

13 (2) Any claim arising with respect to the assessment or collection
14 of any tax or fee, or the detention of any goods or merchandise by any
15 law enforcement officer;

16 (3) Any claim for damages caused by the imposition or establishment
17 of a quarantine by the state whether such quarantine relates to persons
18 or property;

19 (4) Any claim arising out of assault, battery, false imprisonment,
20 false arrest, malicious prosecution, abuse of process, libel, slander, or
21 interference with contract rights, except that this subdivision does not
22 apply to a claim under the Health Pregnancies for Incarcerated Women Act;

23 (5) Any claim arising out of misrepresentation or deceit, except
24 that, in cases of adoption or placement, the State Tort Claims Act shall
25 apply to a claim arising out of misrepresentation or deceit by the
26 Department of Health and Human Services in failing to warn, notify, or
27 inform of a ward's mental and behavioral health history, educational
28 history, and medical history, including any history as a victim or
29 perpetrator of sexual abuse;

30 (6) Any claim by an employee of the state which is covered by the
31 Nebraska Workers' Compensation Act;

1 (7) Any claim based on activities of the Nebraska National Guard
2 when such claim is cognizable under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28
3 U.S.C. 2674, or the federal National Guard Claims Act, 32 U.S.C. 715, or
4 when such claim accrues as a result of active federal service or state
5 service at the call of the Governor for quelling riots and civil
6 disturbances;

7 (8) Any claim based upon the failure to make an inspection or making
8 an inadequate or negligent inspection of any property other than property
9 owned by or leased to the state to determine whether the property
10 complies with or violates any statute, ordinance, rule, or regulation or
11 contains a hazard to public health or safety unless the state had
12 reasonable notice of such hazard or the failure to inspect or inadequate
13 or negligent inspection constitutes a reckless disregard for public
14 health or safety;

15 (9) Any claim based upon the issuance, denial, suspension, or
16 revocation of or failure or refusal to issue, deny, suspend, or revoke
17 any permit, license, certificate, or order. Such claim shall also not be
18 filed against a state employee acting within the scope of his or her
19 office. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to limit the
20 state's liability for any claim based upon the negligent execution by a
21 state employee in the issuance of a certificate of title under the Motor
22 Vehicle Certificate of Title Act and the State Boat Act except when such
23 title is issued upon an application filed electronically by an approved
24 licensed dealer participating in the electronic dealer services system
25 pursuant to section 60-1507;

26 (10) Any claim arising out of the malfunction, destruction, or
27 unauthorized removal of any traffic or road sign, signal, or warning
28 device unless it is not corrected by the governmental entity responsible
29 within a reasonable time after actual or constructive notice of such
30 malfunction, destruction, or removal. Nothing in this subdivision shall
31 give rise to liability arising from an act or omission of any

1 governmental entity in placing or removing any traffic or road signs,
2 signals, or warning devices when such placement or removal is the result
3 of a discretionary act of the governmental entity;

4 (11) Any claim arising out of snow or ice conditions or other
5 temporary conditions caused by nature on any highway as defined in
6 section 60-624, bridge, public thoroughfare, or other state-owned public
7 place due to weather conditions. Nothing in this subdivision shall be
8 construed to limit the state's liability for any claim arising out of the
9 operation of a motor vehicle by an employee of the state while acting
10 within the course and scope of his or her employment by the state;

11 (12) Any claim arising out of the plan or design for the
12 construction of or an improvement to any highway as defined in such
13 section or bridge, either in original construction or any improvement
14 thereto, if the plan or design is approved in advance of the construction
15 or improvement by the governing body of the governmental entity or some
16 other body or employee exercising discretionary authority to give such
17 approval;

18 (13) Any claim arising out of the alleged insufficiency or want of
19 repair of any highway as defined in such section, bridge, or other public
20 thoroughfare. Insufficiency or want of repair shall be construed to refer
21 to the general or overall condition and shall not refer to a spot or
22 localized defect. The state shall be deemed to waive its immunity for a
23 claim due to a spot or localized defect only if the state has had actual
24 or constructive notice of the defect within a reasonable time to allow
25 repair prior to the incident giving rise to the claim;

26 (14)(a) Any claim relating to recreational activities on property
27 leased, owned, or controlled by the state for which no fee is charged (i)
28 resulting from the inherent risk of the recreational activity, (ii)
29 arising out of a spot or localized defect of the premises unless the spot
30 or localized defect is not corrected within a reasonable time after
31 actual or constructive notice of the spot or localized defect, or (iii)

1 arising out of the design of a skatepark or bicycle motocross park
2 constructed for purposes of skateboarding, inline skating, bicycling, or
3 scootering that was constructed or reconstructed, reasonably and in good
4 faith, in accordance with generally recognized engineering or safety
5 standards or design theories in existence at the time of the construction
6 or reconstruction. For purposes of this subdivision, the state shall be
7 charged with constructive notice only when the failure to discover the
8 spot or localized defect of the premises is the result of gross
9 negligence.

10 (b) For purposes of this subdivision:

11 (i) Recreational activities include, but are not limited to, whether
12 as a participant or spectator: Hunting, fishing, swimming, boating,
13 camping, picnicking, hiking, walking, running, horseback riding, use of
14 trails, nature study, waterskiing, winter sports, use of playground
15 equipment, biking, roller blading, skateboarding, golfing, athletic
16 contests; visiting, viewing, or enjoying entertainment events, festivals,
17 or historical, archaeological, scenic, or scientific sites; and similar
18 leisure activities;

19 (ii) Inherent risk of recreational activities means those risks that
20 are characteristic of, intrinsic to, or an integral part of the activity;

21 (iii) Gross negligence means the absence of even slight care in the
22 performance of a duty involving an unreasonable risk of harm; and

23 (iv) Fee means a fee to participate in or be a spectator at a
24 recreational activity. A fee shall include payment by the claimant to any
25 person or organization other than the state only to the extent the state
26 retains control over the premises or the activity. A fee shall not
27 include payment of a fee or charge for parking or vehicle entry.

28 (c) This subdivision, and not subdivision (8) of this section, shall
29 apply to any claim arising from the inspection or failure to make an
30 inspection or negligent inspection of premises owned or leased by the
31 state and used for recreational activities; or

1 (15) Any claim arising as a result of a special event during a
2 period of time specified in a notice provided by a political subdivision
3 pursuant to subsection (3) of section 39-1359.
