1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend sections 60-484, 2 60-4,117, 60-4,144, 60-4,189, and 80-414, Revised Statutes 3 Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to change provisions relating to 4 veteran designations on operators' licenses and state identification 5 cards; to harmonize provisions; to provide an operative date; and to 6 repeal the original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-484, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2018, is amended to read:

3 60-484 (1) Except as otherwise provided in the Motor Vehicle 4 Operator's License Act, no resident of the State of Nebraska shall 5 operate a motor vehicle upon the alleys or highways of this state until 6 the person has obtained an operator's license for that purpose.

7 (2) Application for an operator's license or a state identification8 card shall be made in a manner prescribed by the department.

9 (3) The applicant shall provide his or her full legal name, date of birth, mailing address, gender, race or ethnicity, and social security 10 number, two forms of proof of address of his or her principal residence 11 unless the applicant is a program participant under the Address 12 Confidentiality Act, evidence of identity as required by subsection (6) 13 of this section, and a brief physical description of himself or herself. 14 The applicant (a) may also complete the voter registration portion 15 pursuant to section 32-308, (b) shall be provided the advisement language 16 17 required by subsection (5) of section 60-6,197, (c) shall answer the following: 18

(i) Have you within the last three months (e.g. due to diabetes,
epilepsy, mental illness, head injury, stroke, heart condition,
neurological disease, etc.):

(B) experienced vertigo or multiple episodes of dizziness orfainting ... yes ... no

(4) Application for an operator's license or state identification
card shall include a signed oath, affirmation, or declaration of the
applicant that the information provided on the application for the
license or card is true and correct.

24 (5) The social security number shall not be printed on the 25 operator's license or state identification card and shall be used only (a) to furnish information to the United States Selective Service System 26 under section 60-483, (b) with the permission of the director in 27 28 connection with the verification of the status of an individual's driving record in this state or any other state, (c) for purposes of child 29 support enforcement pursuant to section 42-358.08 or 43-512.06, (d) to 30 furnish information regarding an applicant for or holder of a commercial 31

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1 driver's license with a hazardous materials endorsement to the 2 Transportation Security Administration of the United States Department of Homeland Security or its agent, (e) to furnish information to the 3 4 Department of Revenue under section 77-362.02, or (f) to furnish 5 information to the Secretary of State for purposes of the Election Act.

6 (6)(a) Each individual applying for an operator's license or a state
7 identification card shall furnish proof of date of birth and identity
8 with documents containing a photograph or with nonphoto identity
9 documents which include his or her full legal name and date of birth.
10 Such documents shall be those provided in subsection (1) of section
11 60-484.04.

(b) Any individual under the age of eighteen years applying for an 12 13 operator's license or a state identification card shall provide a certified copy of his or her birth certificate or, if such individual is 14 unable to provide a certified copy of his or her birth certificate, other 15 16 reliable proof of his or her identity and age, as required in subdivision (6)(a) of this section, accompanied by a certification signed by a parent 17 or guardian explaining the inability to produce a copy of such birth 18 certificate. The applicant also may be required to furnish proof to 19 personnel that the parent or guardian 20 department signing the certification is in fact the parent or guardian of such applicant. 21

(c) An applicant may present other documents as proof of
identification and age designated by the director. Any documents accepted
shall be recorded according to a written exceptions process established
by the director.

(7) Any individual applying for an operator's license or a state
 identification card who indicated his or her wish to have <u>a veteran</u>
 <u>designation</u> the word "veteran" displayed on the front of such license or
 card shall comply with section 60-4,189.

30 (8) No person shall be a holder of an operator's license and a state31 identification card at the same time. A person who has a digital image

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and digital signature on file with the department may apply
 electronically to change his or her Class O operator's license to a state
 identification card.

Sec. 2. Section 60-4,117, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2018, is amended to read:

60-4,117 (1) An applicant shall present an issuance certificate to 6 the county treasurer for an operator's license or state identification 7 card. Department personnel or the county treasurer shall collect the 8 9 applicable fee and surcharge as prescribed in section 60-4,115 and issue a receipt which is valid for up to thirty days. If there is cause for an 10 operator's license to be issued, the receipt shall also authorize driving 11 privileges for such thirty-day period. The license or card shall be 12 13 delivered as provided in section 60-4,113.

14 (2) The operator's license and state identification card shall be in 15 a form prescribed by the department. The license and card may include 16 security features prescribed by the department. The license and card 17 shall be conspicuously marked Nebraska Operator's License or Nebraska 18 Identification Card, shall be, to the maximum extent practicable, tamper 19 and forgery proof, and shall include the following information:

20 (a) The full legal name and principal residence address of the21 holder;

22 (b) The holder's full facial digital image;

(d) The holder's date of birth;

(c) A physical description of the holder, including gender, height,
weight, and eye and hair colors;

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26 (e) The holder's signature;

(f) The class of motor vehicle which the holder is authorized to
operate and any applicable endorsements or restrictions;

29 (g) The issuance and expiration date of the license or card;

30 (h) The organ and tissue donation information specified in section 31 60-494;

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1 (i) A <u>veteran designation</u> notation of the word "veteran" as provided 2 in section 60-4,189; and

3 (j) Such other marks and information as the director may determine.

4 (3) Each operator's license and state identification card shall 5 contain the following encoded, machine-readable information: The holder's 6 full legal name; date of birth; gender; race or ethnicity; document issue 7 date; document expiration date; principal residence address; unique 8 identification number; revision date; inventory control number; and state 9 of issuance.

Sec. 3. Section 60-4,144, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2018, is amended to read:

60-4,144 (1) An applicant for issuance of any original or renewal 12 13 commercial driver's license or an applicant for a change of class of commercial motor vehicle, endorsement, or restriction shall demonstrate 14 his or her knowledge and skills for operating a commercial motor vehicle 15 as prescribed in the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act. An applicant 16 17 for a commercial driver's license shall provide the information and documentation required by this section and section 60-4,144.01. Such 18 19 information and documentation shall include any additional information required by 49 C.F.R. parts 383 and 391 and also include: 20

(a) Certification that the commercial motor vehicle in which the applicant takes any driving skills examination is representative of the class of commercial motor vehicle that the applicant operates or expects to operate; and

(b) The names of all states where the applicant has been licensed to
operate any type of motor vehicle in the ten years prior to the date of
application.

(2)(a) Before being issued a CLP-commercial learner's permit or
commercial driver's license, the applicant shall provide (i) his or her
full legal name, date of birth, mailing address, gender, race or
ethnicity, and social security number, (ii) two forms of proof of address

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of his or her principal residence unless the applicant is a program 1 2 participant under the Address Confidentiality Act, except that a nondomiciled applicant for a CLP-commercial learner's permit 3 or nondomiciled commercial driver's license holder does not have to provide 4 proof of residence in Nebraska, (iii) evidence of identity as required by 5 this section, and (iv) a brief physical description of himself or 6 7 herself.

(b) The applicant's social security number shall not be printed on 8 the CLP-commercial learner's permit or commercial driver's license and 9 shall be used only (i) to furnish information to the United States 10 Selective Service System under section 60-483, (ii) with the permission 11 of the director in connection with the certification of the status of an 12 13 individual's driving record in this state or any other state, (iii) for purposes of child support enforcement pursuant to section 42-358.08 or 14 43-512.06, (iv) to furnish information regarding an applicant for or 15 holder of a commercial driver's license with a hazardous materials 16 17 endorsement to the Transportation Security Administration of the United States Department of Homeland Security or its agent, (v) to furnish 18 19 information to the Department of Revenue under section 77-362.02, or (vi) to furnish information to the Secretary of State for purposes of the 20 21 Election Act.

(c) No person shall be a holder of a CLP-commercial learner's permit
 or commercial driver's license and a state identification card at the
 same time.

(3) Before being issued a CLP-commercial learner's permit or
commercial driver's license, an applicant, except a nondomiciled
applicant, shall provide proof that this state is his or her state of
residence. Acceptable proof of residence is a document with the person's
name and residential address within this state.

30 (4)(a) Before being issued a CLP-commercial learner's permit or
 31 commercial driver's license, an applicant shall provide proof of

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1 identity.

2 (b) The following are acceptable as proof of identity:

(i) A valid, unexpired United States passport; 3

(ii) A certified copy of a birth certificate filed with a state 4 office of vital statistics or equivalent agency in the individual's state 5 of birth; 6

7 (iii) A Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the United States Department of State; 8

9 (iv) A valid, unexpired permanent resident card issued by the United 10 States Department of Homeland Security or United States Citizenship and Immigration Services; 11

(v) An unexpired employment authorization document issued by the 12 United States Department of Homeland Security; 13

(vi) An unexpired foreign passport with a valid, unexpired United 14 States visa affixed accompanied by the approved form documenting the 15 applicant's most recent admittance into the United States; 16

17 (vii) A Certificate of Naturalization issued by the United States 18 Department of Homeland Security;

(viii) A Certificate of Citizenship issued by the United States 19 Department of Homeland Security; 20

(ix) A driver's license or identification card issued in compliance 21 with the standards established by the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 22 109-13, division B, section 1, 119 Stat. 302; or 23

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(x) Such other documents as the director may approve.

(c) If an applicant presents one of the documents listed under 25 subdivision (b)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (vii), or (viii) of this 26 subsection, the verification of the applicant's identity will also 27 provide satisfactory evidence of lawful status. 28

(d) If the applicant presents one of the identity documents listed 29 under subdivision (b)(v), (vi), or (ix) of this subsection, the 30 verification of the identity documents does not provide satisfactory 31

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evidence of lawful status. The applicant must also present a second document from subdivision (4)(b) of this section, a document from subsection (5) of this section, or documentation issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security or other federal agencies demonstrating lawful status as determined by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.

7 (e) An applicant may present other documents as designated by the 8 director as proof of identity. Any documents accepted shall be recorded 9 according to a written exceptions process established by the director.

10 (5)(a) Whenever a person is renewing, replacing, upgrading, 11 transferring, or applying as a nondomiciled individual to this state for 12 a CLP-commercial learner's permit or commercial driver's license, the 13 Department of Motor Vehicles shall verify the citizenship in the United 14 States of the person or the lawful status in the United States of the 15 person.

(b) The following are acceptable as proof of citizenship or lawfulstatus:

18 (i) A valid, unexpired United States passport;

(ii) A certified copy of a birth certificate filed with a state
office of vital statistics or equivalent agency in the individual's state
of birth, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, or the
Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands;

23 (iii) A Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the United States
24 Department of State;

(iv) A Certificate of Naturalization issued by the United States
Department of Homeland Security;

(v) A Certificate of Citizenship issued by the United StatesDepartment of Homeland Security; or

(vi) A valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card issued by the United
States Department of Homeland Security or United States Citizenship and
Immigration Services.

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1 (6) An applicant may present other documents as designated by the 2 director as proof of lawful status. Any documents accepted shall be 3 recorded according to a written exceptions process established by the 4 director.

5 (7)(a) An applicant shall obtain a nondomiciled CLP-commercial
6 driver's license or nondomiciled CLP-commercial learner's permit:

7 (i) If the applicant is domiciled in a foreign jurisdiction and the 8 Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administrator has not determined that the 9 commercial motor vehicle operator testing and licensing standards of that 10 jurisdiction meet the standards contained in subparts G and H of 49 11 C.F.R. part 383; or

(ii) If the applicant is domiciled in a state that is prohibited from issuing commercial learners' permits and commercial drivers' licenses in accordance with 49 C.F.R. 384.405. Such person is eligible to obtain a nondomiciled CLP-commercial learner's permit or nondomiciled commercial driver's license from Nebraska that complies with the testing and licensing standards contained in subparts F, G, and H of 49 C.F.R. part 383.

(b) An applicant for a nondomiciled CLP-commercial learner's permitand nondomiciled commercial driver's license must do the following:

(i) Complete the requirements to obtain a CLP-commercial learner's 21 22 permit or a commercial driver's license under the Motor Vehicle 23 Operator's License Act, except that an applicant domiciled in a foreign 24 jurisdiction must provide an unexpired employment authorization document 25 issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services or an unexpired foreign passport accompanied by an approved I-94 form 26 documenting the applicant's most recent admittance into the United 27 28 States. No proof of domicile is required;

(ii) After receipt of the nondomiciled CLP-commercial learner's
permit or nondomiciled commercial driver's license and, for as long as
the permit or license is valid, notify the Department of Motor Vehicles

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of any adverse action taken by any jurisdiction or governmental agency, foreign or domestic, against his or her driving privileges. Such adverse actions include, but are not limited to, license disqualification or disqualification from operating a commercial motor vehicle for the convictions described in 49 C.F.R. 383.51. Notifications must be made within the time periods specified in 49 C.F.R. 383.33; and

7 (iii) Provide a mailing address to the Department of Motor Vehicles. 8 If the applicant is applying for a foreign nondomiciled CLP-commercial 9 learner's permit or foreign nondomiciled commercial driver's license, he 10 or she must provide a Nebraska mailing address and his or her employer's 11 mailing address to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

(c) An applicant for a nondomiciled CLP-commercial learner's permit or nondomiciled commercial driver's license who holds a foreign operator's license is not required to surrender his or her foreign operator's license.

(8) Any person applying for a CLP-commercial learner's permit or
 commercial driver's license may answer the following:

18 (a) Do you wish to register to vote as part of this application 19 process?

(b) Do you wish to have <u>a veteran designation</u> the word "veteran"
displayed on the front of your operator's license to show that you served
in the armed forces of the United States? (To be eligible you must
register with the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs registry.)

(c) Do you wish to include your name in the Donor Registry of
 Nebraska and donate your organs and tissues at the time of your death?

(d) Do you wish to receive any additional specific information
 regarding organ and tissue donation and the Donor Registry of Nebraska?

(e) Do you wish to donate \$1 to promote the Organ and Tissue DonorAwareness and Education Fund?

30 (9) Application for a CLP-commercial learner's permit or commercial
 31 driver's license shall include a signed oath, affirmation, or declaration

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1 of the applicant that the information provided on the application for the 2 permit or license is true and correct.

3 (10) Any person applying for a CLP-commercial learner's permit or 4 commercial driver's license must make one of the certifications in 5 section 60-4,144.01 and any certification required under section 60-4,146 6 and must provide such certifications to the Department of Motor Vehicles 7 in order to be issued a CLP-commercial learner's permit or a commercial 8 driver's license.

9 (11) Every person who holds any commercial driver's license must 10 provide to the department medical certification as required by section 11 60-4,144.01. The department may provide notice and prescribe medical 12 certification compliance requirements for all holders of commercial 13 drivers' licenses. Holders of commercial drivers' licenses who fail to 14 meet the prescribed medical certification compliance requirements may be 15 subject to downgrade.

Sec. 4. Section 60-4,189, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2018, is amended to read:

18 60-4,189 (1) An operator's license or a state identification card 19 shall include a <u>veteran designation</u> notation of the word "veteran" on the 20 front of the license or card as directed by the department if the 21 individual applying for such license or card is eligible for the license 22 or card and:

(a)(i) Has (a) has served in the United States Army, United States 23 Army Reserve, United States Navy, United States Navy Reserve, United 24 25 States Marine Corps, United States Marine Corps Reserve, United States Coast Guard, United States Coast Guard Reserve, United States Air Force, 26 United States Air Force Reserve, or National Guard on active duty in the 27 armed forces of the United States, other than active duty for training, 28 and was discharged or otherwise separated with a characterization of 29 honorable or general (under honorable conditions) from such service; or τ 30 (ii) Has served as a commissioned officer in the United States 31

Public Health Service or the National Oceanic and Atmospheric 1 2 Administration, was detailed to any branch of the armed forces of the United States for service on active or reserve duty, and was discharged 3 4 or otherwise separated with a characterization of honorable or general 5 (under honorable conditions) as proven with valid orders from the United States Department of Defense, a statement of service provided by the 6 7 United States Public Health Service, or a report of transfer or discharge provided by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration; 8

9 (b) <u>Registers</u> registers with the Department of Veterans' Affairs 10 pursuant to section 80-414 as verification of such service; τ and

(c) <u>Indicates</u> indicates on the application under section 60-484 his
 or her wish to include such <u>veteran designation</u> notation on his or her
 license or card.

14 (2) The Department of Motor Vehicles shall consult the registry 15 established pursuant to section 80-414 before placing the <u>veteran</u> 16 <u>designation notation of the word "veteran"</u> on the operator's license or 17 state identification card issued to the applicant. Such <u>designation</u> 18 notation shall not be authorized unless the registry verifies the 19 applicant's eligibility. <u>If eligible, the designation to be placed on the</u> 20 <u>applicant's license or card shall be as follows:</u>

21 (a) The words "Guard-Veteran" for any veteran of the National Guard;
 22 (b) The words "Reserve-Veteran" for any veteran who served on
 23 reserve duty; or

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<u>(c) The word "Veteran" for all other veterans.</u>

25 (3) If the Director of Motor Vehicles discovers evidence of fraud in 26 an application under this section, the director may summarily cancel the 27 license or state identification card and send notice of the cancellation 28 to the licensee or cardholder. If the Department of Motor Vehicles has 29 information that an individual is no longer eligible for the <u>veteran</u> 30 <u>designation</u> notation, the department may summarily cancel the license and 31 send notice of the cancellation to the licensee or cardholder. The

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<u>veteran designation</u> notation shall not be restored until the Department
 of Motor Vehicles subsequently verifies the applicant's eligibility by
 consulting the registry of the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

4 <u>(4)</u> (3) The <u>veteran designation</u> notation authorized in subsection 5 (1) of this section shall continue to be included on the license or card 6 upon renewal of such license or card if the licensee or cardholder, at 7 the time of renewal, indicates the desire to include the <u>veteran</u> 8 <u>designation</u> notation.

9 (5) (4) An individual may obtain a replacement operator's license or 10 state identification card to add or remove the <u>veteran designation</u> 11 notation authorized in subsection (1) of this section by applying to the 12 Department of Motor Vehicles for such replacement license or card and, if 13 adding the <u>veteran designation</u> notation, by meeting the requirements of 14 subsection (1) of this section. The fee for such replacement license or 15 card shall be the fee provided in section 60-4,115.

Sec. 5. Section 80-414, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018, is amended to read:

80-414 (1) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall create and 18 maintain a registry of residents of Nebraska who meet the requirements of 19 subsection (1) of section 60-3,122.04 or subsection (1) of section 20 60-4,189. The Department of Veterans' Affairs may adopt and promulgate 21 rules and regulations governing the establishment and maintenance of the 22 23 registry. The registry may be used to assist the department in carrying 24 out the duties of the department and shall provide for the collection of 25 sufficient information to identify an individual who qualifies for Military Honor Plates or a veteran designation notation of "veteran" on 26 his or her operator's license or state identification card issued by the 27 28 Department of Motor Vehicles. The registry may include information such as identifying information on an individual, an individual's records on 29 active duty or reserve duty in the armed forces of the United States, or 30 an individual's status of active duty, reserve duty, retired, discharged, 31

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1 or other.

2 (2) Any resident of Nebraska who meets the requirements of subsection (1) of section 60-3,122.04 or subsection (1) of section 3 60-4,189 shall register with the Department of Veterans' Affairs using 4 the registry created by this section before being eligible for Military 5 Honor Plates or a veteran designation notation of "veteran" on his or her 6 7 operator's license or state identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles. No person shall be deemed eligible until his or her 8 9 status has been verified on the registry.

10 (3) The Department of Motor Vehicles may adopt and promulgate rules 11 and regulations governing use of the registry of the Department of 12 Veterans' Affairs for determination of eligibility for the issuance of 13 Military Honor Plates or <u>a veteran designation</u> the notation of "veteran" 14 on operators' licenses and state identification cards.

15 <u>(4) The eligibility requirements described in section 60-4,189 that</u> 16 <u>are used in determining eligibility for a veteran designation on an</u> 17 <u>operator's license or a state identification card shall apply only for</u> 18 <u>purposes of such section and shall not apply in determining veteran</u> 19 <u>status for any other purpose.</u>

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Sec. 6. This act becomes operative on January 1, 2020.
