- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to provide for a statewide system
 of data collection on school discipline and law enforcement
 referrals as prescribed; and to provide duties for the State Board
 of Education and school districts.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. The State Board of Education shall implement a statewide
2	system for collecting data on school disciplinary measures and law
3	enforcement referrals, including:
4	(1) The number of students sent to in-school suspension once and
5	more than once;
6	(2) The number of students sent to out-of-school suspension once and
7	more than once;
8	(3) The number of students expelled in total;
9	(4) The number of students expelled under zero-tolerance policies;
10	(5) The number of school days missed by students due to out-of-
11	school suspension or expulsion and the range of dates missed;
12	<u>(6) The number of students subject to mandatory reassignment for</u>
13	<u>disciplinary reasons;</u>
14	(7) The number of students who were referred to a law enforcement
15	agency or official, including school resource officers, for school-
16	related activity;
17	(8) The number of students who were ticketed or arrested for school-
18	related activity;
19	<u>(9) The number of students who were ticketed, arrested, or detained</u>
20	at their school or while actively engaged in or attending any school-
21	sponsored activity or athletic event;
22	(10) The use of restraints in schools, including mechanical
23	restraints such as handcuffs, physical restraint by staff or peace
24	officers, and room confinement or seclusion; and
25	<u>(11) Whether a sworn law enforcement officer, including a school</u>
26	resource officer or juvenile probation officer, is assigned to the
27	<u>school.</u>
28	<u>School districts shall provide the state board with individual</u>
29	student data in order to implement the statewide system. Data shall be
30	collected in such a manner that it may be disaggregated by race or
31	ethnicity, gender, grade level, and whether the student has an identified

1 <u>learning or behavioral disability.</u>
