- 19 of study;
- 20 (5) Private college means an accredited private nonprofit
- 21 <u>institution of postsecondary education located within the State of</u>
- 22 Nebraska;
- 23 <u>(6) Scholarship recipient means a student who has been awarded a</u>
- 24 Nebraska Career Scholarship; and
- 25 (7) Standard college admission test means the national assessment
- 26 instrument that is also used as the standard college admission test
- 27 selected by the State Board of Education and administered to students in

- Sec. 3. (1)(a) The Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges 2
- 3 shall award a Nebraska Career Scholarship that does not exceed a maximum
- of fifteen thousand dollars per year to any eligible state college 4
- 5 student who achieved a composite score on a standard college admission
- test equivalent to a score of at least eighteen out of a maximum score of 6
