Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB1270 would appropriate \$10 million per fiscal year for incentive payments for law enforcement officers.

Section 3 would create a \$1,000 "tier 1" incentive for new law enforcement officers and a \$2,000 "tier 2" incentive for law enforcement officers that have been employed for at least five years.

Section 4 would allow agencies to apply for grants for hiring bonuses.

Explanation of amendments:

The amendment would replace the original bill.

Section 4 would create three tiers of law enforcement officer retention incentive payments based on service after July 1, 2022. Tier 1 would create an incentive for one year of service of \$750 for an officer employed by an agency with more than

\$2,500 for three years of service at an agency with fewer than 75 officers. Tier 3 would create an incentive of \$3,000 for five years of service at an agency with fewer than 75 officers.	
Section 5 would create a program for hiring bonuses at agencies with fewer than 150 off the council's recommended staffing levels.	icers and agencies does not meet
Section 7 would sunset the bill on June 30, 2028.
