## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB256 expands the circumstances when a claim under the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Act can be paid in lump-sum payments rather than periodic payments. Under current law, when an employer and an injured employee or their dependents agree that an amount due should be paid in a lump-sum payment, the settlement must be submitted for approval to the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court if the employee is eligible or will soon become eligible for Medicare. LB256 removes the need to submit a settlement for approval for lump-sum payments if future health care services are not a part of the settlement.

Any settlement affected by LB256 will require all parties to be represented by counsel.
